STANDING ORDER E4

REPORTING OF UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECTS (E:1:1)

National Air Traffic Control Service

1. The Department of Trade and Industry, National Air Traffic Control Services, are required to advise the Military Aeronautical Information Service of all reports of unidentified flying objects and/or similar phenomena coming to their notice. To be of the greatest value, these reports are required in a standard form, giving as much information as possible. When a member of the general public reports such a sighting to the police, it may help them to give the required information if they can be prompted by the correct questions.

2. Set out below is the format to be used as the basis of any notification to the Department of Trade and Industry when any sighting is reported to the police:-

STEALTHY it may be. Pretty it isn't.

Swallow-tailed, with swept-back wings and a fuselage full of sharp, inelegant angles, this jet looks more like an exercise in origami than state-of-the-art aviation.

But the U.S. Air Force, who officially unveiled the little black plane yesterday, are more than satisfied.

The £66million F-117A Stealth fighter has been built to avoid enemy radar detection.

That's the reason for all those angles, which bounce radar signals away from enemy monitors.

The fighter, which first flew in 1981, has been a poorly-kept secret. It's actually been flying for seven

Not-so-secret Stealth jet is unveiled at last

years out of a desert base in Nevada. The jets were used in combat for the first time in the U.S. invasion of Panama in December and at least one of the aircraft has already crashed on a training flight over California.

The Air Force said 59 of the jets were being built by the Lockheed Corporation and all but three have already been delivered.

It carries only a pilot and flies at a

high sub-sonic speed of nearly 600mph. Just 66ft long and with a wingspan of slightly more than 43ft the aircraft is about the size of the F-15 jet, the Air Force's current top-line conventional fighter.

The F-117A can be refuelled in air, giving it an unlimited range, according to the Air Force.

The programme has demonstrated that a stealth aircraft can be designed for reliability and main-

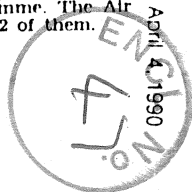
tainability,' a spokesman said. Unlike many modern fighter jets, the F-117A is designed to fly slower than the speed of sound, depending on its stealth characteristics to keep it from being detected and shot down.

The fighter, which the Air Force said carries an internal weapons load, dropped 2,000lb bombs near a military barracks to frighten Panamanian forces loyal to General Noriega during the Panama invasion.

The jets recently began daytime operations and are expected to move to Holloman Air Force Base in New Mexico this summer.

The Pentagon has unveiled the fighter jet while Congress and the Defence Department are battling over whether to complete the B-2 stealth bomber programme. The Air Force wants to buy 132 of them.
