Thank you for your letter of the 21st. July concerning the recent incident I reported.

As you may have gleaned from my report neither I nor my two companions on this occasion have the slightest interest in UFOs in the normally accepted sense, neither do we consider that this 'sighting' would have been in an etherial category. Neither, also, did any of us imagine we were witnessing anything which suggested any sort of threat to the security of the Country.

If we thought there could be a sinister conotation to the incident it would have related to the possibility of it being connected in some way to the unauthorised 'delivery' of prohibited materials into the country. In hindsight, it was thought surprising that the County Police did not take that view and, at least, cause local enquiries to be made - through the local officer.

We, ourselves, tended to dismiss the idea as the incident occurred some distance from a road or pathway.

Whatever the incident does not suggest, it certainly does to the apparent ease with which an aircraft can arrive and depart without anyone (in an official capacity) being any thewiser.

As I mentioned in my report, it is not intended to take the matter further from this direction.

#### MOD STATEMENT ON UFOS

- 1. The sole interest of the Ministry of Defence in reported sightings of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs) is to establish whether or not they have any bearing on the defence of the country. Information on UFOs is evaluated only as one part of the Department's overall interest in the air defence of the United Kingdom.
- The MoD has no section dedicated to the study of UFOs, nor any staff employed on the subject full time. Sighting reports that are received are referred to air defence staffs who check that they do not provide evidence of a threat to the continuing security and defence of the UK or an unauthorised incursion into UK airspace. Unless it is judged that there is a threat, and this has not been the case so far, the MoD does not attempt to investigate or identify whatever might have been seen.
- 3. Because MoD's interest in UFOs is limited to possible defence implications the Department does not undertake general surveys or studies into the scientific significance of the phenomenon, nor does the MoD have the resources to do so. Defence funds are already fully committed to the continuing security of the UK against, primarily, the threat of aggression from the Warsaw Pact countries. As such the use of finite resources on scientific investigations could not be justified, unless a clear threat had been identified.
- 4. Most reputable UFO organisations in the UK are fully aware of the MoD's limited involvement with this subject and, as far as can be ascertained, accept that the MoD in no way attempts to conceal activity from the general public.

Thank you for your letter to the Prime Minister on the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs) which, as the appropriate Department, has been passed to the Ministry of Defence for reply.

As you will be aware from our previous correspondence, although the MOD does receive and co-ordinate some reports of UFO sightings, our sole concern is to determine whether or not they present a threat to the security of the United Kingdom. If we do not feel that this is so, and this has been the case so far, we do not attempt to investigate the incident further, or identify what might have been seen. Additionally, the MOD does not have any department which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying the phenomena, nor do we have any staff employed on the subject full time. As you will expect, therefore, we do not carry out investigations into the phenomena, nor do we have the resources to do so.

With regard to your second, as far as we are aware, there has been no further debate on the subject of UFOs in the House of Lords. And, as I have said in the past, I would like to assure you that there is no attempt to conceal the "truth" about the phenomena, or cover up incidents reported to us. Indeed, it would be a nonsense to attach such significance to a simple lack of staff, resources and direct interest in the subject.



I hope you will find it useful to know that while the MOD does receive and co-ordinate some information about UFO sightings, our sole concern is to establish whether or not they present a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do - and this is not normally the case - we do not attempt to investigate or identify what might have been seen. Additionally, the MOD does not have any department which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying UFO reports, nor do we have any staff employed on the subject full-time. As you will expect, therefore, we do not carry out studies or investigations into the phenomena, nor do we have the resources to do so. In this context, I am sorry to say that I am unable to offer you any definitive explanation as to what you might have witnessed, though it is possible that the lights you saw were reflections rather than emitted light from an object.

I would like to thank you again for taking the trouble to make a report, and I hope this reply will be helpful to you.

#### A REPORT ON A CURRENTLY UN EXPLAINED INCIDENT.

On Saturday, the 6th. May 1989 this reporter and two Lady companions were travelling along the A 32 road in a motor wehicle at about 5.15 p.m. and had reached a point about one kilometre north of the crossroads at West Meon Hut ahen the attentions of all three occupants were attracted simultaneously and decisively to a bright light coming from the area since identified as Bailey Green - towards the East of their position. The conditions at the time were that of a fine late alternoon with little cloud and with a strong light from the westren sun. Upon each person asking the same question 'what is that bright light' the motor car was brought to a standstill on the western side of the roadway and the occupants alighted to see what they could the more easily and went over to the east side of the road where there was a gap in the Reige and from which position the 'object' could be seen without obstruction and at a chatance since gauged to be slightly under 1 kilometre. From this position the viewers saw the very bright lights against the backdrop of tall trees bordering a field of growing crops on the far side since sited as being adjacent to 0.S. Map Reference 663270 but were unable to identify or despite the object litself other than to agree that it appeared to be the size a large motorcyle seen head-on or such as the frontal view of the fuselage It was further agreed at the time and since of a small aeroplane. that any outline was in the nature of being indistinct - one viewer calling it 'fuzzy'.

The object was seen to descend sharply to a height of about 15/20 feet above the standing young crop where it hovered in one position still facing the viewers and still emitting two or more strong lights which the viewers had at first thought could have been the reflection of the sun (behind them) on a windscreen or similar reflecting material. During the short period of hovering two of the viewers thought they were watching the 'antics' of a small helicopter (in which case it could have been difficult, if not impossible to see its rotor blades - because they would be roughly in the same plane) but this was discounted on account of there being no discernable down-draught effect on to the standing crops - they were quite undisturbed. For the same reason,

Was

the thought/that the object was not supported by a 'James Bond' system of downward-thrusting jets (which would certainly have flattened any sort of crop).

After about a minute or less appearing to slowly gyrate over one spot the object turned sharply through 90 degrees towards the North and a further line of trees bordering that edge of the field and, in spite of it turning the previously thought 'headlights' continued to shine as brightly from the left side of the object. The object gathered speed and, maintaining the same height above ground, appeared to 'charge' the line of trees, which were estimated as being about 60 feet in height, as if to go through them. At the last moment, the object appeared literally to 'jump' the line of trees after which time it was lost to view from the viewers position.

Immediately after seeing the object disappear over the line of trees (roughly coincident with 0.S. Grid Line 27) the viewers returned quickly to the motor car and drove to the area beyond (on the North side of) the latter trees - reasonably expecting to see the object and discern what, in fact, it was, but although there was clear country in the area there was no sign of any aircraft - in the air or on the ground. It could be regarded as significant that at no time during the initial observations or the sequel described above, was there any sound at all let alone such sound as usually relating to small aircraft.

A few days after the incident, the writer and his Wife (two of the viewers) returned to the area to endeavour to locate anyone who had heard or seen of the incident and, although this included making contact with the owner of the field of 'standing crops' referred to earlier in this report, and living adjacent to the secondary field towards which the object 'flew' when it disappeared, no one was contacted who had had any knowledge of the incident. Questioned as to the possibility of cropspraying having been in progress the owner said that this had not taken place in the vicinty 'for years' - neither had any activity such as described been authorised in the area.

The following factors should be considerd in conjunction with the above Report:-

As to the Viewers.

These are the Writer of this report, a retired Squadron Leader (RAF) and one-time Member of the RAF Central Flying

School and past Member of the Popular Flying Association who has maintained a superficial interest in that latter body which exists to supervise and encourage builders of 'Home-made' seroplanes and do likewise in the field of experimental light aircraft (but who is not now so directly associated in that field), the writer's Wife who is of a Family known in the field of sporting fly ing prior to WW II, and their sister-in-Law whose background is that of Wartime RAF and WHNS. Each is in the category of a retired person but has no knowledge nor interest in such as what is termed Unidentified Fly ing Objects (UFOs). Neither viewer would be likely to ascribe the recent experience to supernatural or other like basis, neither would they in any way be given to aspects of fancy. that each viewer - reckoning that there could be a possibility of reportage of the incident - conferred with the others immediately after the incident and were in complete agreement as to what each had witnessed. Notes were taken but little or nor discussion has taken place between viewers since the incident and there is, therefore little if any likilhood of embilishment of report.

#### As to the Object.

machine it is most likely that one or more of the viewers would have indentified it as to category of aircraft but it was not of recognisable shape and the brilliance of the lights (which were not confined as to position to the front of the object) precluded any sort of appreciation. For the same reason no marks of indentification could be seen. The craft was evidently extremely manoeuvrable, especially in vertical control. As stated in the report, no sound came from the object as would cetainly have been the case had it been in the category of, say a light helicopter or ultralight aeroplane — at the distance seen.

#### As to the conditions.

The afternoon was one of excellent visability though this factor would have only marginally assisted seeing the craft from the position described, owing to the comparatively short distance involved. The sun, being behind the viewers, would not have detracted from viewing. Wind conditions were light.

The following are considered by the Writer as being significant:

(a) The apparent abundance and brilliance of the lights.

- (b) The ability of the aircraft to hover closely over growing crops without any apparent disturbance of crops due to any downward thrust. (Note, the viewers did not reckon at the time or thereafter to inspect the field concerned, partly because the area was clearly private and partly because such inspection would not (presumably, at the time) have proved anything. The incident occurred before the more recent reporting of 'flattened crops' or similar.)
- (c) The ability of the aircraft to stay in one position clear of the ground, if it was not of helicopter category.
- (d) The remarkable ability of the craft to 'jump' a 60 ft. screen of trees always assuming that a pilot would be fool enough to try such otherwise dangerous exercise.
- (e) The complete absence of aircraft noise in the relatively calm conditions which pervaded.

#### THE WOGAN SHOW - POSSIBLE FEATURE ON UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECTS

- 1. US of S(AF) will wish to be aware that the Department has been approached by a researcher from the BBC Wogan Show regarding a feature they are considering on Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs).
- 2. If the feature is to go ahead, and this is still far from clear, the programme will focus on the allegations of a Government cover up of the 'true' facts of the UFO phenomenon. The researcher claims to have an expert who has seen classified MoD documents which confirm that the Department has a section dedicated to the study of UFO activity and seeks to ensure that this knowledge is concealed from the public. As the Minister will be aware, although Sec(AS) receives and coordinates information that the MoD receives on reported sightings, the Department does not attempt to carry out scientific investigations or general surveys into the subject.
- 3. To balance the programme, which we understand would be broadcast either at the end of the month or in the autumn, the BBC have asked whether the appropriate Minister, in this case US of S(AF), would be willing to appear on the programme and answer the "expert".
- 4. The MoD's line on UFOs, which has been deployed over many years, emphasises that the Department's interest is strictly limited. There is little that can be added to this, and MoD representation is unlikely to affect the outcome of the programme one way or another. Indeed participation might reinforce the misconception that the MoD has a significant interest in the UFO phenomenon. On balance, therefore, we would advise against participation by a Minister, or indeed any other MoD representative, offering to the BBC instead a statement of MoD policy on UFOs along the lines of the attached draft. It is possible that this approach may also cause the programmers to reconsider the value of the feature since without someone to counter the allegations of a "cover up", it will be difficult for the lively debate, which they are seeking to generate, to take place.

5. I should be grateful to know if US of S(AF) is content for the suggestion of MoD participation to be politely declined and for the attached statement of MoD policy, which is in keeping with that adopted in all Parliamentary and public correspondence on this subject, to be forwarded to the BBC via the Defence Press Office.

Who or what was responsible for the perfectly formed circles which were appearing in the cornfields of southern England?

Everything from hedgehogs to aliens had been blamed. Now, as the team settled down to their long vigil, they felt confident that their sensors and scanners, the best that high-tech could offer, would solve the puzzle.

They were mistaken, Dawn broke to reveal a new circle appeared behind their camp. The riddle of the rings was as perplexingly intact as

In fact, so far this summer 151 new rings have been spotted, leaving farmers and researchers scratching their heads

Despite their confusion, the ories abound as to what causes

"It is common to get small whirlwinds in hot weather. In Australia they call them dust devils. You can't see them most of the time though, unless dust or smoke is caught up."

A spokesman says: "If you tried to fly a helicopter upside down it would make a greater mess of a field than just a circle when it crashed."



You may find it useful to know that the Ministry of Defence does receive and co-ordinate some information about UFO sightings, but our sole concern is to establish whether or not they present a threat to the security of the United Kingdom. If, as is generally the case, we do not feel that this is so, we do not attempt to investigate further. Additionally, the MOD does not have any department which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying UFO reports, nor do we have any staff employed on the subject full-time. As you will expect, therefore, weddo not ccarry out studies, investigations or surveys into the phenomena. Nevertheless, we do, of course, recognise that many strange things are to be seen in the sky, although we believe that rational explanations can be found for most of them. Indeed, we have yet to receive any conclusive evidence to suggest that alien spacecraft have landed on the planet.

Thank you for your letter of 2 June which enclosed an account of an alleged Unidentified Flying Object (UFO) being studied by the MoD on Foulness Island. You asked for my comments on this particular case.

I think it would be helpful if I explain that the Proof and Experimental Establishment (P&EE) at Shoeburyness is responsible for the firing, and hence testing, of batches of ammunition coming in to service with the United Kingdom Armed Forces. They, like all other MoD establishments, do not involve themselves with the study of unidentifiable 'alien' craft. As such, I can only say that the story you have obtained from your informant is ridiculous in the extreme. Certainly there has never been any form of UFO on Foulness Island and similarly the MoD has not made any contact with alien lifeforms.

As requested I have endeavoured to treat Mr Cain's statement seriously but fear that I have found it to be the best fiction I have read in a long time. Nevertheless I have the following observations to make. Firstly, if the object was such an important find, why was it towed to the UK for investigation? Surely the Americans would wish to examine it in house. Similarly, do you not find it strange that nobody saw the object, which Mr Cain states as having a circumference of nearly a mile, when it was being towed across the Atlantic behind a Battle Cruiser. This is notwithstanding the fact that the Royal Navy does not operate such ships nowadays. In addition there are a number of contradictions in the article, for instance at one stage he says that the object was encased in concrete, at another he mentions that it was taken to Australia. Apparently overnight! There are numerous other incredible statements but I do not feel that I need mention these to prove my point.

Although I doubt that this was the answer you would have wished for, I hope you will find some food for thought in the above.



On Saturday, 27th May, 1989 Section 40 did a taped interview with Mr Paul Cain (Pseudonym) at his home in Southend on Sea, Essex. She was part of an investigative team from the 'East Anglian UFO & Paranormal Research Ass' called in following a telephone call by Mr Paul Cain to a local newspaper. He originally stated he had phoned the paper in response to reading about some of the 'flying multi-coloured balls' sighted by local residents. Three other investigators from the East Anglian UFO went with Sheridan, including the Director of Investigations.

A 'Flying Saucer', supposedly brought down by the 'Military', has been subjected to intensive investigative proceedures at a Hoarding near Foulness Island in Shoeburyness, off Southend.

The craft is reported to have been forced down In 'Arizona' sometime during 1984. It was decided to tow it to the East Coast of England, and a Battle Cruiser was commissioned for the job. Since no method of penetrating the vehicle could be found, attempts to fly it were out of the questione.

Investigations involving Scientists, the Military, other government bodies and various technical specialists have been going on secretly ever since. One person involved in all this is Paul Cain. He is one of those people outside the ranks of 'official' employees, the MOD occasionally calls upon.

Paul was first approached by them after he joined the army as a Conscript, at eighteen. At the time he felt it was all fun and games, and thought:
"Oh yes, we are going to be the elite group". There were sixteen of them.
But he has advised his own family never to join the MOD, "Because once you do, they never leave you alone".

Paul was once part of a team working in Africa with the 'Mau-Mau'.

Another job involved travel to the West Indies, where he was an advisor to Tom Adam's government.

His involvement in the 'Flying Saucer' project began last September 1988. "I was asked by certain parties whether I was interested in looking at a machine they had aquired".

He was picked up by a civilian driver, and on arrival near the site he was taken to a changing room to be stripped and Xrayed. A set of white overalls were provided, and he got into a vehicle with about a dozen other people. They travelled about 3 miles.

When they got out they saw a big Hoarding about ten to fifteen feet high, and an estimated mile long. It was slightly curved, and surrounded by tre es. 300/400 yards further on he saw various other smaller hoardings.

Whe 'aul first saw the vehicle he'd been called in to investigate, he was amazed. He said to a couple of other fellows, "What the hell is this?"
Two of them spoke English, and another answered through an interpreter.
This particular man Paul later leadned was a Russian Psychic, specially flown to Britain as part of a desparate attempt to gain access to the interior of the 'Flying Saucer'. Four years of scientific and technical research had come up with nothing, and the final resort was to encase it permanently in concrete. Paul and his colleagues were officialdom's last attempt to solve the problem. When they asked how to get into it they were told, "That is for you to find out". If anyone can get into it, you are the people. That fellow over there will be able to do it".

When Paul asked who he was, he was told, "You'll get to know who he is if the project comes to anything in due course". The fellow' in question was the Russian Psychic.

The Flying Saucer was neither hot or cold to the touch. In pacing it out Paul discovered it had a circumference of I,538 paces. It's height was only 4ft 3/4inches, but it weighed an estimated 3,000 tonnes. The shape was flat, thin, and round. It shimmered like water when seen from a distance, but the real colour was a light silver, grey. It's texture was smooth, but microscopic inspection showed it to be made from millions of minute, coloured particles which look rough until you touch it.

I asked Paul ; if it could be made from organic material, and he told me: "Recently a colleague decided it may actually be a vegatable substance."

Five months after they first joined the project, electro-magnetic resonances successfully caused a flap on the underside to open. This proceedure is believed to have been the responsibility of an un-named Science Professor from Edinburgh University. (Paul Cain has refused to disclose the actual names of other colleagues involved in this project.) The entire vehicle is only 'Egg Shell' thick.

"If you were to get a piece of Plasticine and pull it out, you wouldn't be able to see any joins. That is how these doors and flaps are attached. There are two elastic type contraptions which drop away, and then swing down."

Dur the opening of the flap around 200 people were present. Internal investigation of the dark interior was conducted by torchlight. They had entered an oval shaped tube, where Paul found numerous round balls. At that stage no-one picked them up.

The Russian psychic entered the vehicle after everyone else had left. Later he emerged with one of the balls in his hand. They are about the size of an orange, and coloured the same as the craft but absorb and give out a multitude of shades in various degrees of light reflection. Incredible, they weigh only a quarter of an ounce. Each ball appears to be very thin, BUT ALL ATTEMPTS TO BRAKE ONE HAVE FAILED. ONE HUNDRED TONNES OF PRESSURE SUBJECTED BY A 'PRESS' FAILS TO AFFECT THEM.

But, the Russian Psychic, nick named while holding one of these balls in his hands suddenly said: "I can bend it. I can feel it bending. Its moving, it's bending. It's with me".

Then eleven flaps on the top of the vehicle opened. Too small to enter, they measured I4/I5 inches across. These were later determined to be inspection hatches. Probes, with camera's and tubes were inserted, and they discovered that each inspection hatch goes into a tube. The tubes run into each other via linked flaps. The hatches slant diagonally about 30/40 degrees into the next tube.

Apart from thousands of the peculiar balls, nothing has ever been found inside the Flying Saucer. There are no instrument panels, flashing lights, seats, or storage compartments. Only two area's remain uninvestigated, and these are completely sealed. It is estimated they are probable 18 inches deep, and 30 feet across. One at the top, and another at the bottom. They are attached in a half circle running from the centre of the craft. Sonic soundings have established them to be hollow.

Inside one of the tubes is a tank, inside of which can be seen little black hairs. It probable contains a liquid, but the device is totally sealed. It is thought to be the brain child of the craft, storing information.

- Paul says, "They believe the Saucer sucks in light while flying, which it then spins around a tube."

"What has been learned so far covers such a short period. The opening of this machine, and everything else has all happened in a matter of months. There's a lot more work and knowledge to uncover. More people will come on the scene. People like myself will be a thing of the past. New people, new ideas, new technology, machinary and testing methods will emerge. They may even cut out a piece. From this similar machines may be developed for our own use!"

According to Paul Cain , many contries are involved in this project.

Britain, the United States, Russia, France, Germany, India and

Israel - to mention a few. International finance is involved. But until now, the only people to have known anything about this originally highly secret project have worked internationally on a 'need to know only basis'.

I asked 'Paul how it was he could now speak to me, and was told of concern for the loss of around 200 of the odd little coloured balls. These, and many others became activated by the investigations. Some flew out of the ship and were lost. Local coastal area's have recently received reports of sightings of the balls. People have seen them in their gardens.

No-one finding one of them should attempt to touch them, and the public are advised to contact their local police, or other official sources.

Paul mentioned to a superior that he was considering writing a book about the project, and was told: "That's all right, do so. No-one will believe you".

The timing of all this is potentially interesting, in that two days after this interview the Flying Sauceb was removed from 'Foulness Island', and is now supposed to be on it's way to an undisclosed part of the Continent of Australia.

The craft was removed on Monday, 29th May, The following day Paul went to his pick up point, and waited for the special bus with two other un-named colleagues. It failed to collect them. The next day - wednesday 31st - he received a phone call informing him of the removal of the Flying Saucer to Australia. He believes permission was granted him to speak out, with the departure date in mind.

ked him if the Russian Psychic had gone home.

"I suppose so. A certain party one day made a comment about his presence, and his interpreter said to him. 'This person says, out of all the millions of people in this country, why does it have to be a Russian'? His answer, through his interpreter, was this. 'If they have anyone else better than me, go and get them".

Pressed for a physical description, told me:

"He is in his late fourties. He has been tested in the Soviet Union for many years. He is believed to come from Leningrad. He has a picture of two little girls which I suppose are his children".

Paul also mentioned a 16 year old American boy who was a mathematics genius. He could calculate faster than a computer. But it isn't in his self interest to recall this boy's name.

At this point in time it is interesting to speculate about the possibility of those multi-coloured flying balls the size of an orange, turning up in some people's gardens, - down under. It may be worth watching for certain headlines in Australian Newspapers.



I was surprised to see your mention of your letter of 1 December last. Having had a search through my papers, I regret that we do not appear to have received it.



THE WOGAN SHOW: FORTHCOMING FEATURE ON UFOS

1. I have been contacted by a researcher - Section 40 - on the Wogan Show regarding a feature they are considering on UFOs.

- 2. The gist of their "attack" is that there has been a massive cover-up by the Government over UFO activity. They claim to have an "expert", whose name Section 40 would not reveal, who says he has seen secret MoD documents which reveal that there is a section within the Ministry devoted to UFO activity and to ensuring that the high level of UFO activity is concealed from the public. This, they say, has been confirmed by ex-MoD civil servants.
- 3. If they go ahead with the programme, it would be broadcast on a Monday evening (the most "serious" of their three weekly shows) either at the end of July or in the autumn. They have asked whether the appropriate Minister would be willing to appear on the programme and answer the "expert".

- 5. Section 40 repeated that this was to be a serious investigation and I accordingly undertook to seek the views of officials. I would be grateful for your thoughts on this in due course.



Thank you for taking the time to report to the Humberside Police the unusual sighting that you witnessed on the evening of 1 June 1989, a copy of which has been passed to me.

I think you may find it helpful if I first of all explain that whilst the Ministry of Defence does receive and co-ordinate some information about Unidentified Flying Object sightings, our sole concern is to determine whether or not they present a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do, and this is not normally the case, we do not attempt to investigate or identify whatever might have been seen. In this context, I therefore regret that I am unable to offer you any definitive explanation as to what you might have witnessed, although from the description of the lighting pattern, I would suggest that it could have been an aircraft or helicopter.

Given our limited involvement with the subject, the MoD does not have any department which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying UFO reports nor do we have any staff employed on the susbject full time. As you will expect, therefore, we do not carry out studies, in depth investigations, or surveys into the phenomenon, nor do we possess the resources to do so. Nevertheless, we do, of course, recognise that many strange things are to be seen in the sky, although we believe that rational explanations could probably be found for most of them. Possibilities that spring to mind include satellite debris re-entering the Earth's atmosphere, ball lightning, unusual cloud formations, or aircraft lights to mention just a few.


As you know, we have already spoken at length about the 1957 sighting to which you refer and I regret, therefore, that I have nothing further to add to my letter of 17 April.


I refer to your letter of 11 May addressed to Sec(AS)2. As this office is responsible for the Department's records we have been asked to reply on their behalf.

Our enquiries indicate that there are no Ministry of Defence records on this subject in the Public Record Office. A House of Lords debate on the topic on 4 March 1982 revealed that all "unexplained sightings" reports prior to 1967 have been destroyed. Those created since that date, in common with all other government records, are subject to the provisions of the Public Records Acts and would not be available for public scrutiny until the expiry of the 30 years retention period.

In the absence of any official papers I can only refer you to commercially available books and publications which may indicate other primary source material and which may enable you to draw your own conclusions on this phenomena.


I have been asked to reply to your recent letter in which you asked a number of questions about the Ministry of Defence's attitude to UFOs.

The answers are as follows:

- 1. The sole concern of the Ministry of Defence is to ensure that the reports we receive do not present a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom. The MoD does not attempt to investigate reported sightings unless a threat is identified. No such cases have ever been identified.
- 2. The MoD has no department which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying UFO reports. Reports are referred to MoD air defence staffs who examine them as part of their normal duties. Because of our limited involvment with this particular subject we do not, nor do we have any need to, interview individuals who might have witnessed an unusual incident. Indeed, unless we judge that a sighting poses a threat, and this has not been the case so far, the MoD does not attempt to investigate or identify whatever might have been seen.
- 3. The MoD maintains a policy of keeping all sighting reports we receive. Regrettably, because of a lack of resources we are unable to initiate general surveys or searches through our files. You may be aware that all MoD files are subject to the Public Records Act which means that after closure they remain closed from public viewing for 30 years. However, we are able to answer any specific queries you may have about particular incidents which have occurred recently and can let you know whether we have a report on the incident and if so what it contained.

In conclusion, I can say that the very vast majority of sightings have a terrestial explanation (including the UFO kite flying club). The MoD does not possess any positive evidence that "alien spacecraft" have landed on this planet



Although I have the dubious pleasure of answering public correspondence on this subject we agreed that in this instance it would be more appropriate for you to reply. Question 4: Although it is not possible for us to release material "en bloc" due to the provisions of the Public Records Act, which affects all governmental files, we are able to answer any specific queries individuals might have about particular incidents which have occurred recently and can let the person know whether we have a report on the incident and if so what it contains.
- e. Question 5: As Question 1.
- 2. I also attach a fairly recent copy of our standard paragraphs.


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
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

Thank you for your letter of 4 May which asked about our policy on the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs).

I think it would be helpful to say that we do not have a "policy statement" as such, indeed, our involvement with the subject is minimal. Nevertheless, we do receive and co-ordinate reports of UFO sightings that have been sent in to us by members of the public, although our sole concern is to determine whether or not the sightings present a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do, and this has not been the case so far, the Ministry of Defence does not attempt to investigate or identify whatever might have been witnessed.

Because of our limited involvement with the phenomenon, the Ministry of Defence has no department which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying reports of UFOs and we have no staff who are employed on the subject full time. The sighting reports we receive, which usually are limited to the brief details of the incident passed onto us by those who witnessed them, are referred to our staff in the departments which are responsible for the air defence of the United Kingdom, and they examine the reports as part of their normal duties. Additionally, we do not carry out full time studies into the phenomenon nor do we have the resources to undertake any indepth investigations or general surveys. I hope that you will appreciate that defence funds are already fully committed to the continuing security of the UK against, primarily, the threat from the Warsaw Pact countries. This being so we could not justify the use of defence funds on scientific investigations, unless a clear threat to the security of the UK had been identified.

Nevertheless it is clear from the reports that we receive that many strange things have been observed in the sky, although we believe that rational explanations could probably be found for most of them. Possibilities that spring to mind include satellite debris re-entering the earth's atmosphere, ball lighting, unusual cloud formations, meteorological balloons, aircraft lights, aircraft at unusual angles or a host of other things. Certainly, we have yet to receive any conclusive evidence to suggest that alien spacecraft or beings have landed on the planet.






I have passed a copy of your letter on to both the pilots for their response and am also writing to the addresses that you supplied.

What puzzles me is that an order to fire was apparently given in peace time in UK airspace and yet you have no record of it - on the assumption that both pilots are telling the truth, have you any explanation for this?

Referring to our various telephone conversations. I again repeat my request for you to let me have your father's address and/or telephone number as if even if he were not directly involved in the event he may be able to put me in touch with someone who was, or at least he might be able to supply me with a list of names, addresses and telephone numbers of possible witnesses.

With regard to an entirely different event, please note that a colleague and myself have been in touch with a former RAF member of Air Crewe who informs me that he and his colleagues had a visual/radar sighting whilst in flight and were apparently subsequently de-briefed and told that they must not breathe a word of the event to anyone on penalty of some sort of disciplinary action — can I have your comments since I feel certain that if I could produce to the former RAF Air Crew concerned a letter on your notepaper confirming that no disciplinary action will be taken against the men concerned they would speak freely about their experience.

Information that my colleagues have gathered concerning this sighting would tend to suggest that in view of the design, appearance and speed and manoeuvres of the object that it was certainly not a Warsaw pact aircraft!



Again, on another note, I am receiving anecdotal hearsay reports of the photographing of a number of UFO's by the Brazillian Government, of objects which have apparently fired beams of light at Brazillian Indians causing burn marks on the victims skin and also causing one individual to die from a heart attack caused by the stress of the experience — do you have any information concerning this?

I am also hearing anecdotal rumours and gossip concerning an actual 'Alien Base' which is located somewhere in the southern part of the United States or South America - have you heard any of these rumours and if so, what is your opinion of them?

I would not have mentioned these rumours to you but for the fact that I keep hearing them from different quarters.





# **WEDNESDAY 21st OCTOBER 1987**

The Aviation Medicine and Test Pilots Group of the Royal Aeronautical Society will hold a one day Symposium on High G and High G Protection – Aeromedical and Operational Aspects.

The agility of air combat aircraft has increased to the extent that the limited G tolerance of their crews is now restricting the overall system performance. Of particular relevance are the sustained turn rates achievable – 9G or more – and the rate at which this acceleration level can be applied – within 1 sec or less. This latter factor can lead to a potentially disastrous G-induced loss of consciousness (G-LOC).

The opening papers will address current operational aspects, the physiological mechanisms which determine G tolerance and the reported incidence of G-LOC in the Royal Air Force. Papers in session two will describe equipment for G protection, both current and developmental, including anti-G suits and valves, regulators to give positive pressure breathing related to G and their in-flight evaluation, and the potential for detecting early G-LOC so as to initiate autorecovery. Papers in the final session will be concerned with possible methods for enhancing G tolerance and their influence on future aircraft designs.



# ONE DAY CONFERENCE-THURSDAY 13 APRIL 1989 FLIGHT CREW INTERFACE WITH AIRCRAFT

It is widely recognised that advances in technology particularly over the last decade have had a significant effect upon the operational and economic efficiency of both civil and military aircraft. Today's cockpits are equipped with electronic flight instrumentation, flight crew implement their commands by electrical or electronic signalling and integrated management and flight control systems provide safe, care-free, handling and optimize the configurations to the prevailing flight regime.

Flight crew have responded to these changes in a flexible and responsive manner, seeking to influence requirements and implementation of such systems to meet their professional needs.



Thank you for your letter of 2 March 1989 which asked for the Ministry of Defence's comments on the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs). As the MoD's point of contact with those who wish to correspond on this particular topic, your letter has been passed to me for a reply.

Before I attempt to answer your questions I feel it would be helpful if I explain that, contrary to the advice given in Section 40 book, the MoD has a very limited interest in the UFO phenomenon. Indeed, our sole concern is to determine whether or not reported sightings of UFOs present a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom and unless we judge that they do, and this is not normally the case, no attempt is made by the MoD to investigate or identify whatever might have been seen. The vast majority of information that we have on the subject are sighting reports, usually limited to the brief details of the incident, passed on to us by those who witnessed them. These are referred to our air defence staffs who examine them as part of their normal duties.

Since our interest in UFOs is limited to possible defence implications we do not carry out studies into the UFO phenomenon nor do we have the resources to undertake any indepth investigations or surveys. Moreover, we have no department which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying reports of UFOs and we have no staff who are employed on the subject full time.

Moving now to your particular questions, you will understand that because of our limited involvement with the subject we have little information on it. However, I can categorically confirm that the MoD does not possess any conclusive evidence which suggests that alien spacecraft or beings have either landed in or have communicated with this planet. As far as sightings within this country are concerned, I think it would be useful to say that from the reports that we have received there appears to be no evidence to suggest any connection between military installations and the location of sightings; I would suggest further that we have received more

from areas which are not connected with the military.

On a more general note, we would not disagree that strange things have been (and are being) observed in the sky, certainly the reports we receive bear this out. Nevertheless, we believe that rational explanations can probably be found for many sightings. Possibilities that spring to mind include aircraft lights, Meteorological balloons, satellite and meteorite debris and ball lighting to mention but a few.

I hope that you will find this helpful.

Thank you for your letter of 5 April which explained that you would like some information on Unidentified flying Object (UFO) sightings for your school project on "UFOs, Mysteries, Myths and Legends". Although I will do what I can, you will see that our involvement with this fascinating subject is actually quite minimal.

The Ministry of Defence's main concern with UFOs is to determine whether or not they present a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom, for instance unwanted intruders such as Russian "BEAR" reconnaissance aircraft coming into UK air space. Unless we judge that they do, and this rarely is the case, I regret that we do not attempt to investigate or identify whatever might have been seen.

The vast majority of information that we have on the subject are sighting reports, usually limited to brief details of the incident, passed onto us by those individuals who witnessed them, and who felt strongly enought about it to report it. Once received they are referred to our staff in the sections responsible for the air defence of the United Kingdom and they examine the reports in the course of their day to day duties.

Although we are generally not able to release sighting reports that we might have received, I am pleased to attach a copy of the sighting report Lieutenant Colonel Charles Halt of the United States Air Force submitted following the incident witnessed at Rendlesham Forest, Suffolk on 27 December 1980. This is quite a famous sighting on an alleged UFO and was widely reported in the newspapers. However, I regret that this is all we have on the incident and because we did not consider the events to be of any defence significance we did not investigate it further.

Despite our limited interest in the subject, we do not recognise that many strange things have been (and are being) observed in the sky; certainly the reports we receive bear this out. However, we believe that rational explanations could probably be found for many sightings. Possibilities that spring to mind include aircraft lights, Meterological balloons, satellite and meteorite debris and ball lighting to mention but a few. Indeed I have witnessed many an aircraft over London which have looked mysterious during the dark hours of night.

I am sorry that I have not been able to shed a light on the mysteries of the UFO phenomenon, I'm sure we would all like to know, but I hope that you will find this helpful nonetheless.



Thank you for your letters of 23 March to RAF Cottesmore and Headquarters Strike Command on the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs). These have been passed to me for reply.

As a member of BUFORA you may already know the Ministry of Defence's involvement with this particular subject, if not I will take the opportunity to briefly explain. Essentially, the MOD's sole concern is to determine whether or not reported sightings of UFOs present a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom and unless we judge they do, and this is not normally the case, no attempt is made by the MOD to investigate or identify whatever might have been seen. Nevertheless the sighting passed on to us by those who witnessed them are referred to our air defence staffs who examine them as part of their normal duties.

Turning to your letters, you requested any assistance that we may be able to offer in helping you identify three sightings recently witnessed in the Tamworth area. First of all I would like to confirm that we received two reports which appear to coincide with the October 1988 sightings, but not, I'm afraid, the other two. I attach copies of the reports for your information, but in line with our policy to maintain the privacy of the reports originators, their identifying details have been obscured.

Although it is clear your witnesses saw something unusual, I regret that, because we have not investigated the incidents I cannot give you a definitive answer as to their cause. However, although I am unable to give you a conclusive steer with the 10 March 1989 sighting, you may be interested to know that red and green flashing lights are obligatory navigational fitments on all aircrafts. As such it is likely that the sighting was one of an aircraft.

I hope that you will find this helpful.

Many thanks for your recent letter regarding my various enquiries of UFO reports within the Midlands region and your Department's activities concerning some of these.

First of all, I would like to say how fully aware I am of your Departments's work-load, particularly with regards to various RAF enquiries as well as to Parliamentary Questions and Ministerial matters. On top of that I know that you have to cope with the numerous enquiries from civilian UFO groups, some of them (this one which I hope is not included) which must be cranky and a complete waste of Departmental time.

I also realise that AS-2 is merely a clearing-house for the bulk of low-level UFO reports and that your principle work involved low-flying aircraft matters. It would seem that the bulk of higherlevel reports, perhaps involving alleged landings, close encounters, physical traces, and reports by military personnel or over sensitive areas, would no doubtbe handled by other agencies that even you may not be aware of ( past Under-Secreataries of the Department have found this to be so), involving RAF Rudloe Manor and DI 55, for example.

I thus understand your difficulties when it comes to effectively responding to the various enquiries that may come your way, and it may prove productive if these bodies could respond to such requests.

It has been noted that the MoD has been increasingly active on the "public relations" front over the last few numbers, notably with regards to the opening up of certain sighting reports (copies of certain reports were gratefully received from you recent ly).

This activity is also evident in other areas of the world where governmental departments that deal with the UFO phenomenon are allowing access to data to either the public or to serious parties. Examples can include the Royal Australian Air Force that some years back allowed Australia's leading ufologist, Section 40 to access to many of their files.

This policy can only be welcomed in open arms and such actions will be greatly respected by serious students of the phenomenon (although allowances will have to be made with respect to very sensitive data, the protection of witnesses's privacy, and assurances that enquirers are serious and are backed by a reputable organisation).

To this end I am enclosing a copy of a recently completed case report on one of the cases that I originally brought up with you — the Little Hayward, Staffordshire landing with physical traces case of August 4 1988. Some material is missing from the report due to the cost of copying (such as typed interview transcripts and various documents) but I hope this will suffice. I would appreciate it if you could ensure that a copy of this goes to the other agencies involved in the investigation of UFO reports, such as RAF Rudloe Manor. Hopefully, this will illustrate firstly our degree of seriogeners in co-operation with other official bodies (either open or covert), and secondly our high standards of investigation and scientific approach to UFO reports.

It is obvious that the MoD are simply missing some of the most evidential cases that have been occurring and which are being followed up, or at least reported to, civilian bodies ( some of them I admit are very amateurish and a discredit to serious ufology). Also, where such reports have been notified to MoD agencies or are known to them, much valuable data is being missed through poor investigation and lack of resources and/or commitment. Considering that the MoD have a far greater number of UFO reports than those reported to BUFORA, and the percentage of BUFORA cases involving landings, abductions, physical traces, etc, this surely is an indictment of the amount of data on the UFO phenomenon that the MoD must possess and , also, the amount of valuable data that is being ignored or poorly recorded.

I do hope that the above will be taken into consideration when official policy is being reassessed and that my proposals will be accepted. I would be grateful if these could perhaps be brought to the attention of other official agencies involved for due consideration

#### ABSTRACT

The case involves the sighting by two witnesses in a car of a large luminous cloud with a pulsating red light that disappeared into the distance from its initial sighting point beside a read.

The fellowing day the witnesses noticed that at the same spot where the cloud had been seen a section of the readside hedge had been partly uprocted and pushed back. The physica -1 damage was still apparent when the sighting was investigated by a joint investigation team of LUFOIC, BUFORA and SKYSCAN. after nearly 2 menths,

# BRIEF FACTS

- 1.1 In the early hours of the morning of 12-August 1988 Mr and his? girl-friend, Ms were returning from a Gingerbread meeting at Cannock when they encountered a large luminous cloud by the side of the read.
- 1.2 Mr was able to see the object depart across the road and disappear as he stopped the car on the hard verge by the bridge which carries a minor road to their home in nearby Little Hayward.
- 1.3 The fellowing day both witnesses observed that a stretch of hedge had been damaged where had seen the cloud at the side of the road.
- 1.4 Although the police were notified nothing was actioned by them, although Section 40 contacted the local newspaper, the Stafferdshire Newsletter, and its editor, Mr Section 40 took the story and photographed the scene for an article.

## DISCOVERY

- 2.1 The RIC of the Midlands, Section 40, was informed by telephone of the case by Section 40 after the story was circulated through BUFORA.
- 2.2 The case was passed to Section 40 ef SKYSCAN as the nearest competent investigator but due to mechanical difficulties with Section 40 car he was prevented from investigating the case.
- 2.3 Eventually, due to the obvious physical traces at the site the author decided to investigate personally although by then Section 40 had managed to secure his car 7 readworthy and so a joint investigation was undertaken on 1 October.

#### THE WITNESSES

- 3.1 Mr (considered) is an engineer at the parties of the parties o
- 3.2 It can be postulated that such a severe traumatic experience has influenced

Mr to misperceive the object that heclaims to have seen, or maybe the event has created sufficient emotional energy for such an object to materialise in real space-time, or in his imagination. Howver, Ms was also witness and it was her who first saw the object and had a close look at it.

- 3.3 Ms would appear to be Mr girlfriend or certainly friend who assists Mr in bringing up his children. They were both attending a Ginger-Bread meeting in Cannock at the time of the event.
- 3.4 Mr appears to be quite forthright and fairly self-opinionated, but his general intelligence and awareness, level of conversation and reasoning suggests that Mr is a good witness subjectively speaking. He did not appear to elaborate the sighting or claim aspects of the sighting that we ascertained that he could not have seen.
- of almost naivety. Her level of education and intelligence suggests that she has fairly rudimentary knowledge of UFOs and a pretty basic level of communication.

  Although she saw the object quite close-up her levels of observation and communication are such as to reduce the value of her report. It would seem possible that some of her testimony is influenced by Mr own personality as this factor did come across at the interview, Mr obeing quite definite and interruptive with his children and Ms howevers the investigators were able to reasonably conclude that Ms dod see something unusual and that she described it basically, and that Mr saw the object as it was in the air.
- 3.6 It is the author's opinion that, subject to certain weaknesses in the witnesses, both are honest in their reporting and both back each's story up, but with variation as one would expect with the fact that both saw it at slightly different times.

# THE EVENT - SIGHTING

- Cannock at about 00.05 hrs on 12 August 1988 when Ms noticed a luminous cloud by the side of the A 513 road, just before they reached a minor crossroads and before Wheatman's Bridge that takes a minor road to Little Hayward about a mile to the north(the Staffs Newsletter are incorrect as it states that they saw the object just after they crossed Wheatman's Bridge).
- 4.2 As Mr was turning right to cross the bridge he too saw it as it moved into the air and watched it as it disppeared and then re-appeared before disppearing altegether.

- 4.3 Ms had the closest view of the object and she was shocked by its sudden appearance by the side of the road, on the left-hand side (south of the road).
- 4.4 She thought that Mr was going to crash into it and her silence at its appearance made Mr realise that something was odd. It would appear that deer are common in that area (sighting occurred on northern limits of Cannock Chase), and Ms was watching for deer. She was thus looking out at that side and therefore spotted the object.
- 4.5 She described the object as "a big cloud...all red". That it was "like a ring", and on the floor at the time that she saw it. She also said that it looked hazy underneath and more solid on top.
- 4.6 Mr neticed the quiteness and looked up and at 45-50 degrees angle through the windscreen as he was preparing to turn right, and saw a gaseous cloud, with a red pulsating semi-saucer shaped light enveloped by a mist. It was then estimated as 30 feet in the air and it sped away, re-appeared and then disappeared northwards.
- 4.7 It was estimated as 30 feet in diameter and appeared to contain a circular object within a diffused mist. The edges of the cloud touched the ground and the nearby hedge also. Mr described the cloud as "fluorescent" and that it contained a an apparent solid structure within it.
- 4.8 The experience was of short duration, and roughly estimated as no more than a minute, although it is the considered opinion of the investigator that a duration of between 15-30 seconds is perhaps more accurate.
- 4.9 The light within the cloud was described as very bright had not it been encased within the cloud.
- 4.10 The gas cloud was described as being "contained" and not spread out like mist.
- 4.11 The red light was pulsating slowly and did not really change appreciably, perhaps more of an eclipsing movement of the light by the surrounding gas cloud.
- 4.12 No edours were reported.
- 4.13 Although the witnesses reported a strange sense of quietness, no elements of "missing time" were apparent, and the sensation of quietness can perhaps be explained as there being no traffic at that time of night and the shock of seeing the object and one's concentration of attention and senses on the one event.

- 4.14 Ne sound was heard emanating from the object at any time during the experience.
  - 15 There were no other witnesses or potential witnesses to the event.
- 4.16 Neither witness reported any sere eyes, sickness, headaches, dizziness, sunburn, water problems or any stress-related disorder.
- 4.17 The gas cloud was sufficiently of substance to obscure not only the hedge but a sign warning motorists of deer.
- 4.48. The car appeared to function perfectly during and after the event and nothing wrong was reported to the car lights, radio or engine.

# THE EVENT- DAMAGE TO HEDGE

- 5.1 The day after the sighting both witnesses noticed that the hedge at the spot where the object had been seen was damaged.
- 5.2 Both witnesses reported that the leaves of the hedge were dying but not scorched. and then parts had been pushed back.
- 5.3 About 5 metres from the minor crossroads (Seven Springs/Little Hayward/A513), southwest, and on the side of a gate was a stretch of damaged hedge.
- 5.4 The hedgerow had been damaged for a distance of 3.5 metres as measured by the investigation team (and leter confirmed by a visit by Section 40 meteorologist, who studied the site in October 1988.
- 5.5 The hedge was quite dense and reached a height of some 1.5 m and an estimated height of 0.5 m of more recent growth, characterised by recent twig growth.
- 5.6 The damaged section was characterised by uprooted sections and with broken and sever ed branches, some areas of which had been devoid of bark.
- 5.7 It was evident that the section of the damaged hedge was dead, and the leaves on that section had died. Parts of this section had been pushed into the field, away from the road (Pasture field).
- 5.8 Apart from sections strip ed by the investigation team for analysis, parts of the branches had received mutilation in the form of stripped bark, which was apparent on the readside of the hedge ("scuff marks"), and some occurred on the field side but only in connection with a wire fence

- (presumably as the weight/force if the object pushed the hedge against the wire).

  Some of the scuff marks were up to 25 cm long.
- 5.9 Two branches were uprocted, and one was shattered vertically from the root upwards.
- 5.10 There were no skid marks on the read, and no tyre marks or any other sign of disturbance on the grass verge adjoining the hedge. (however a section of a car's number plate was visible at the site (we declined the suggestion that this belonged to the UFO).
- 5.11 The scuff marks appeared concentrated in the centre of the damaged section, some 4p from the very extreme edge, and some 3 m to the uprooted branch.
- 5.12 On the scuff marks of one branch the bark appeared to be pulled back, suggesting that the object had reversed.
- 5.13 The departire of the object as measured by the angle of the collapsed portion of the hedge and a prismatic compass was found to be 243 degree (SWW).
- Section 40

  noticed that a tree between the main road (A513) and the minor road

  (to Seven Springs) was surrounded by substantial branches which had broken off.

  He adds that one of the branches had been twisted around and pointed in the opp site direction from theread.
- 5.15 No evidence of scorching or charring were found, and it was found that the leaves had died due to their parent branches being uprooted and shattered.

### THE INVESTIGATION

- 6.1 Section 40 and Section 40 accompanied the author to interview the witnesses, which was taped.
- 6.2 The site was visited and photographs, soil and bark samples, taken, and measurments taken.
- 6.3 Correspondence was undertaken with Section 40 in another example of cooperation between BUFORA and TORRG, as the possibility was mooted that a descending vortex may have been responsible. Correspondence was also undertaken with Section 40 Section 40 (BUFORA, IUN) for details on the geology of the region, and with Section 40 Section 40 who analyses the samples.

6.4 One of Section 40 associates, Section 40 (J.Met observer/TORRO investigator), of Section 40 also visited the site and supplied weather
data.

## SAMPLING

- 7.1 8 samples were taken, including 3 control samples: leaves, bark and soil were taken from the damaged hedge, and 3 lots of control samples from outside the affected area.
- 7.2 These were sent to Section 40 ef Sheffield University who analysed them.
- 7.3 However, there was insufficient material for a proper and rigourous testing and the length of time and lack of hard data of the object causing the damage made any results limited in value.

# RESULTS OF SAMPLES

8.1 Section 40 examined the samples for evidence of heat damage, metallic traces (it was suggested that scraping of the hed ge may have left micro-traces of the object as it passed through/over the hedge - see Secorroce landing and metallic traces). physical damage and any unusual features.

Tor nr

- 8.2 Sample 1 consisted of 2 twigs and leaves (hawthorn). There was no evidence of any heat damage. It was found thatin comparison with the control sample the affected leaves had been severely dehydrated, probably as a result of being deprived of sustenance when the branch had been uprooted.
- 8.3 The bark samples did not reveal any unusual marks when examined microscopically. No metablic traces were noted and no sign of charring. Section 40 found that the presence of fungal hyphae and algae ruled out any exposure to heat as it would have destroyed these organisms.
- 8.4 The soil samples contained plant roots that showed no signs of heating.
- 8.5 In summary, therefore Section 40 found nothing unusual in any of the samples, and it was therefore possible that a natural occurrence may have caused the damage (farm machinery/vehicle). Both Section 4D and the author agree that without a definite lead or more evidence further examination would be unlikely to produce any further evidence of unusual activity at the site.

ing day.

Frem information kindly supplied by Section 40 and by Section 40 it was found that the evening of 3/4 August 1988 was quiet.

9.2 The weather details are summarised below:
Cloud cover- sky half-covered, becoming clearer.

Cloud type- Strato-cumulus, becoming clear to bring cirrus.

humidity - moist

wind - westerly to south-westerly

speed - 4knots to 1 knot.

weather - slight mist, thinning; drizzle; cloudy becoming sunny in afterneon;

cloudy evening; mist/dew developing in course of night and sunny fallew-

- 9.3 In essence, the weather that evening was clearing to bring mist and dew, implying (as well as supported by wet/dry bub thermometers) that there was sufficient moisture in the air, and the temperature was decreasing, and the wind was light and westerly to south-westerly.
- 9.4 It could be deduced that mist was responsible for the sighting, but it can be equally argued that the object was well-defined and glowing, and made off rapidly. The witnesses had observed mist on that stretch of road before and it can be certain that they would not have mistaken mist for the object described, and whichwas seen at close range and did not appear in the beam of the car headlights.
- 9.5 If a descending vortex was responsible then the object was moving in direct opposition to that of the wind direction, namely NNE to SSW. It could be feasible however, that upper air turbulence, perhaps aided by the presence of high ground to the SW (150 me within ½ km, and 200m within 2½ km, the Cannock Chase plateau). may have created a descending vortex that gathered its own momentum and acted as an independent entity. Certainly, the topography and wind directions are conductive for the creation of a vortex, occurring as it may have done so, in the "mystery circle" period of late summer, with a clear and moist night.

## GEOLOGY

- 10.1 Section 40 of BUFORA and the IUN kindly supplied geological details of the area.
- 10.2 The site is situated on the northern extremity of the Cannock Chase plateau, NW of Rugeley, Staffs.
- 10.3 The actual sighting location is itself located on the boundary between the sand-

stone escarpment of Cannock Chase and the shales to the north.

- ...4 Apart from heing on a geological boundary there are numerous faults nearby, one running parallel to the River Trent (which also runs parallel to the site and the A513). It is only 1 km from the nearest fault which intersects a larger one that runs SSE through Rugeley.
- 10.5 Tee further faults run at right -angles to the A513 appreximately  $\frac{3}{4}$  km from the site to the W.
- 10.6 According to current research and thinking within the Earthlights hypotheses, such a geologically faulted zone is ideal for the possible production of tectonically created electrical discharges: micro-earthquake activity may result in the build-up and possible discharge of such charges when pressure upon the rocks reaches a critical level. Such discharges, so the hypotheses gons, may be seen in the form of glows and balls -of-light.
- 10.7 It must also be pointed out that not 1 km away, in a S direction, is a place name of "Hell Hele". Such a fortean place name that is associated with strange events (well-documented throughout the world) lends credence to the possibility that the immediate area is prone to "supernatural" manifestations, interpreted as either ghosts, goblins, or indeed UFOs.
- 10.8 Since the object observed by the witnesses appeared to all intents and purposes, only semi-solid (despite the fact that the witnesses thought that the centre of the cloud was solid) it can be suggested that the object was a ball-of-light surrounded by gas, and its sighting at that spot being theresult of its natural creation by tectonic forces, and manifesting itself as a discharge, disappearing into the distance towards the faults to the NNW about 1 km away.
- 10.9 The damage to the hedge (if it can be definitely be tied in with the timing of the sighting of the object) is more difficut to explain. It could be meeted that the earthlight, through spme physical process unkinown to us at present, created a vertex of turbulent air currents or eddies, and thus damaged the hedge by uprecting parts of it. How this process would occur, if at all possible, is uncertain.
- 10.10 Whatever, it is the investigator so epinion that the geology is of important consideration in the debate over the nature and origin of the object observed by Mr and and REDACTED ON ORIGINAL

#### A POSSIBLE VORTEX ORIGIN?

11.1 The earthlights hypetheses in this case, although valid, may not be able to fully

satisfactorily explain this particular sighting.

- A vertex in the region is a distinct possibilty, and would explain the damage to the hedge ina more than adequate manner. Such descending vertices (new being studied and recorded by Section 40 of the Jeurnal of Meteorology, and which have been adequately associated with the 'mystery circles' of the summer in southern England which appear in corn-fields) would have the necessary energy, if actually touched the ground, to create the damage inflicted upon the hedge. Indded. it is within the bounds of informed speculation that such a descending vertex could have descended right on top of the hedge.
- 11.3 It is known that the rates of spin within the contra-rotatating sets of vortices that make up the so-called "fair-weather stationary whirlwind", can produce static build-up. Such vortices have been known to cause burns to humans and to vegetation upon contact.
- 11.4 It is also concectivable that the rates of spin may be more than sufficient to cause a charge separation to occur, so that such a descending vortex can literally glow in the dark. This would be more than adequate to account for the glowing red light that appeared to pulsate seen by the witnesses.
- 11.5 Thus, to the witnesses at night, the weakening and eventual extinction of the vortex may be interpreted as the recession and disappearance into the distance of the object. Again, this is what may have happened at Little Hayward; the object was seen to lift into the air and recede, disappear and then to re-appear and then disappear again.
- 11.6 Again, although the object was observed to move from a NE to SW direction (as evident also from the angle of the uprooted hedge), the wind direction was conduictive to the creation of a vortex as it moved over the Cannock Chase plateau. Certainly, from at least 1km to the SW are suitable topographical barriers that would potentially create eddies in the prevailing wind from the SW and W: Haywood Hill, Satuall Hills, and Oak Hill.
- 11.7 Eye-witness accounts of the formation of vapour vertices exist in the meteerological literature (eg Avebury; Carron Forest, Scotland). These indicate that where conditions are suitable vertices can form, and be partly visible when sufficient water vapour exist in the atmosphere. These have, on at least the Avebury example, to have been noted in conjunction with the appeareance of "mystery circles" in the adjoining fields.
- 11.8 Thus it would imply that given sufficient meisture in the atmosphere, such vertices can be made visible. The Little Hayward sighting was seen within a cloud of gas

that could represent vapour droplets, "similar to a CO2 extinguisher cloud".

- .9 It would seem that saturation levels have to be reached before this phenomenon occurs, and the formation of fog would imply that, as is evident by the night of 4 Augsut, being misty, dewy and clear.
- 11.10 It can be concluded, therefore, that what the witnesses observed were the lower ends of a spinning vortex made visible by the condensation of water droplets in the core as a result of the reduced air pressure. The actual height of the object would depend upon the depth of the saturated air. Its consequent recession and disappearance would therefore be attributable to the vortex disappearing above the layer of near-saturated air and thus extinguishing the presence of visible water droplets.
- of spinning within the column have been achieved (as evident by the damage to the hedge), then charge separation of the static within the column could make the air within it glow. Its pulsating nature could thus be explained as either differe tial glow within the core(similar to a lighthouse beam), or to the eclipsing affect of the enveloping water droplet cloud.
- 11.12 As suggested by the work of Section 40 and Section 40 the damage to nearby crops suggests that a stage must be reached where the vortex breakdown leads to the plunging of such damaging winds. The damage to the hedge would thus be attributable to this damaging phase and its consequent disappearance from astride the road and hedge to extinction would imply that the energy of the vortex had been dissipated.
- 11.13 It is also relevent to note that the River Trent lies only several tens of metres from the sighting location, and would thus qualify as being a source of the satuarted air at that particular spot.
- 11.14 If the path of the vortex moved SW then it may have also been responsible for the damage to the tree beside the minor road on the opposite end of the field.

#### SUMMARY

- 12.1 A luminous cloud with a central red light was observed by two witnesses one night that was leter found to have been associated with a damaged hedge. The object was surrounded by a gaseous cloud and was observed for seconds only.
- 12.2 It is strongly indicated that the hedge was associated with the light event and that the hedge had been pushed away from the field.

- 12.3 The conditions under which this occurred were misty with dew forming, and since the circumstances were right for a vortex to form with the SW/W winds that eveining it has been strongly suggested that a descending vortex was observed.
- 12.4 The saturation of the air would have made the vortex visible, being seen as a gaseous cloud, and if the rates of rotation were powerful enough, then a glow may have been visible. Its recession and disappearance could be accounted for by the dissipation of the vortex, which would rise up into the air.
- 12.5 Vertex breakdown would result in damaging winds to form which would damage either crops("mysbey circles" in corn-fields, eg the Oadby Ring, Leics), destruction to fences (eg the Kidderminster Event), or, as in this case, damage to hedging.
- 12.6 The vortex hypotheses would account also for the lack of odours (although car was mowing and windows up), the lack of sound, and the lack of physiological effects upon the witnesses. It would also account for the ghostly appearance of the object, and the effects upon the hedge which would require some energy to carry out.
- 12.7 No scorching or charring were found either by visual examination or by analysis carried out in the laboratory. Nether were metallic fragments found within the bark fragments obtained from the "scuff marks" on some of the branches. It was assumed that a solid object would have completely uprocted the hedge and broken branches an and twigs around the site, although the scuff marks would ceratially indicate the passage of a solid object. If the vortex hypotheses is taken into account the damaging whinds would account for the damage seen at the site.


### RECCOMENDATIONS

- 13.1 It is the investigator's opinion, based upon examination of the site, interviews with the witnesses, laboratory analysis, topographical survey, and weather data, that a descending vortex was responsible for the object seen and for the damage to the hedge.
- 13.2 Hower, it is the investigator's conclusions that some consideration should also be given to the relationship between local geology and topography and meteorology. Are the presences of faults and the geological boundary and the occurrence of the fortean place name of 'Hell Hole' coincidental? Can tectomic disturbances create micro-environments that are conductive to the localised formation of vertice development? Can ionisation from certain anomalies within the earth give rise to atmospheric disturbance.? Further research within the context of earthlights and earth energies in general is required before we are closer to understanding the mechanics of electrcal effects upon the weather.

- 13.3 Perhaps the relationship is as follows: areas (such as faults and charged sites perhaps with fortean place mames) with a strong ionising potential may become highly charged negatively with the passage of a positively-charged cloud, and the immediate area positively charged. Due to the high density of charge in such highly localised area a stream of charge may be sprayed upwards. Such an electric wind may create a vertical wind and it is possible that throughtthis mechanism that a dexcending vortex may take place.
- 13.4 There is a strong link between UFOs, sacred sites, geology and folklore and abnormal weather ( see Section 40
- 13.5 It is the investigator's epinion that a certain portion of unknowns in past UFO data can be adequately explained within the parameters of the descending vortex hypotheses, but to sound a note of caution, only a limited number which fit the general charactersistics of the phanomenon observed and the local topographical and meteorological conditions prevailing at the time of the occuurence. Certainly, glowing/pulsating lights or objects (with humming/screaming sound or not) which recede and disappear quickly, and which may create damage should be scrutinised with careful consideration of the vortex hypotheses. Even daylight sightings may also be subject to this theory as saturation point within the atmosphere may creeate a water droplet cloud and, particularly, if the vortex touches the ground, may pick up dust and other debris to form a variety of Shapes in the air, Similarly the possibility must be mooted as to whether the static build-up within a vortex could discharge to a human, possibly resulting in shock/trauma/unconscious and the potential emergence of unconscious abduction scenarios Section 40 The static build-up may also affect vehicle electrics and electrical appliances, and certainly result in physical effects and even physiological effects.





Thank you for your letter of 10 April concerning the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs), which asked for information on an unusual sighting witnessed in the Macclesfield area on 28 October last year.

As a member of MUFORA you probably know that the Ministry of Defence's sole concern with the phenomenon is to determine whether or not UFOs present a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do, and this is not normally the case, we do not attempt to investigate or identify whatever might have been seen. In addition, the vast majority of information that we have on the subject is limited to the sighting reports that we receive from those who witnessed them.

Moving now to the sighting that you are particularly interested in, I regret that a search through our file did not reveal any reports which correspond to the details given in your letter, and because we did not investigate the incident I can not give you a definitive explanation as what may have been seen. Nevertheless, I can confirm that it is highly unlikely that RAF helicopters, or other RAF aircraft for that matter, would have been operating in the area at the time in question. I regret that we do not possess details of British Aerospace flying activity and would suggest, therefore, that you contact them direct. Lastly, as you know the location of the sighting falls within the flight path of aircraft using Manchester airport and I hazard a guess that your witnesses observed an aircraft, or aircraft, associated with this.

Thank you for your letters of 3 and 4 March to the Ministry of Defence on the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs). As the MODs point of contact for those who wish to enquire about this particular topic I have been asked to reply.

I think it would be helpful if I first of all explain that the sole concern of the MOD with this subject is to determine whether or not UFOs present a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom and, unless we judge that they do, and this is not usually the case, we do not attempt to investigate or identify whatever might have been seen.

Given our limited involvement with the subject, the MOD does not have any department which is solely appointed/studying or collecting data on UFO reports nor do we have any staff employed on the subject fulltime. The vast majority of information that we have are sighting reports, usually limited to the brief details of the incident passed on to us by those who witnessed them, which are referred to staff in the departments responsible for the air defence of the United Kingdom and they examine them during the course of their day to day routine.

Nevertheless it is quite clear from the reports that we receive that many strange things have been and are being observed in the sky, although we believe that rational explanations could probably be found for most of them. Possibilities that spring to mind include satellite debris re-entering the earth's atmosphere, ball lighting, unusual cloud formations, meteorological balloons, aircraft lights, aircraft at unusual angles to mention just a few.

You also asked about viewing any information on UFO sightings that we might have received. Although I regret that the release of any material on the subject "en bloc" is not possible because of the provisions of the Public Records Act, which states that official files should generally remain closed from public viewing for 30 years after the last action has been taken, we are able to answer specific queries about particular incidents which have occurred recently and can let you know whether we have a report on the incident and if so what it contains, However, due to our limited resources, I regret that I can not instigate general searches through our files.

Lastly, you may be interested toknow that archived Governmental material is held by the Public Records Office at Kew, London and they may be able to help you further.

I hope that you will find this helpful.

Thank you for your letters concerning the unusual incident witnessed over East Anglia during May 1957. I am sorry that I have not been able to reply before now. As you know, we discussed this particular sighting at some length over the telephone a few months ago and although I have nothing further to add, I feel it would be useful to briefly recap the main points we covered.

You asked for any information that we might have on a reported sighting of a UFO seen from a USAF F-860 Sabre aircraft on 20 May 1957 whilst it was flying over East Anglia. Regretably, enquiries with our Air Historical Branch, who archive Air Force Department matterial, did not reveal any information which supports the accounts of your two witnesses. Nevertheless, we were able to establish that RAF Manston was used by the USAF at the time and that Sabres were, indeed, operating from there. However, because RAF aircraft were not involved with the incident the MOD does not possess any record of the sorties that were alleged to have taken place, although it is possible that given USAF aircraft were involved, the USAF may hold records relating to their operations in the United Kingdom. As such I would suggest that if you wish to pursue this matter further, you contact the USAF direct. I hope you will find the two addresses useful.

Although not related to this particular incident, you may find it helpful to know that the Public Records Office at Kew holds Government Records which are over thirty years old and that they may be able to help you with other enquiries you may have on incidents which occurred during the 1950s.

I am sorry that I can be of no further assistance with this particular case, but nevertheless wish you luck with your endeavours.

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




Dear Sir/Madam,

I write this letter in the hope that you may be able to help me in putting some light on a number of unidentified objects that have been sighted over the past year.

I am at present investigating a number of UFO sightings over the Tamworth area on behalf of BUFORA and was told that you may be of some assistance in helping me identify them. I will there fore describe what was seen.

The first sighting was on saturday May 21 1988 between the hours of 8.40 and 9.30 pm. Two objects were seen in the night sky over the Gungate area of Tamworth and were described as a bright white/yellow light similar to a star with smaller red and orange lights surounding it, giving the appearance of a horse-shoe shape. The way in which the smaller lights flashed made it look as if they were rotating around the larger light. (There seemed to be eight smaller lights in all). The two objects were some distants apart one appearing north easterly in the sky and the other in a south easterly position. They remained still for about twenty minutes when they both suddenly started to move rapidly. The objects made no noise what so ever and finally disappeared after moving off in a north easterly direction. The objects were described as bieng high in the sky.

The second sighting was on thursday 27 October 1988 and were seen over the Belgrave area of Tamworth between the hours of 8.30 and 9.00 pm. The2objects were described as a white light which seemed to spin around with two main red lights in the centre. Around these lights were smaller blue and orange/yellow lights. It was rounded off at the bottom but seemed to taper into two points towards the top. the objects seemed to be 45-50 degrees in the sky and were close together, they made no noise and moved slowly untill disappearing over some houses.

The third sighting occured on friday 10 March 1989 between the




hours of 8.50 and 9.05 pm. One object was sighted over the the Amington area of Tamworth. It was described as three bright white lights in a triangle formation with dim red light in the centre. On one side of the triangle was a small green flashing light and on the other side a small red flashing light. The object appeared to be approx 45 degrees in the night sky and moved very slowly with no sound towards Tamworth town centre where it finally disappeared.

I would be most gratefull for any information that you may be able to give me concerning these cases such as RAF training exercises or whether the descriptions that i have given you match up to any of your RAF air craft.

I look forward to hearing from you and hope that the above requested will not take up to much of your time.





Thank you for your letter of 23 March and indeed your previous of the Autumn of last year. I am sorry for the delay in replying.

Before looking at your latest letter in detail I think it would be helpful if I explain our involvement with the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs), as it appears that there might be some misunderstanding. Whilst I regret that there is some delay in replying to individuals corresponding on the subject, I should say that this is caused, primarily, by our Ministerial and Parliamentary work which we carry out on behalf of the Air Force Department. I hope you will understand, therefore, that this work, which is not insubstantial, must take priority over requests for information such as yours, however regrettable that may be. Additionally because of our heavy workload on RAF operational matters we do not have the resources to spend a large amount of time on each UFO enquiry that we receive.

As you may already know, the only information that we have on UFOs are the sighting reports passed on to us by those who witnessed them. These are usually limited to the brief details of the incident and are referred to our staff in the departments responsible for the air defence of the United kingdom who examine them during the course of their normal duties. But unless we judge that a sighting report presents a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom, and let me assure you that this is not normally the case, we do not attempt to investigate or identify whatever might have been seen. From this background I hope you will understand that for the most part we do not possess any information, other than any reports that we might have received, on incidents which involve unusual aerial activity. Moreover, I would expect that more often than not, because of your specific interest in the subject, UFO societies would have more information than we do.

Moving to the detail in your letters I would, first of all, like to say that for the reasons above it is extremely unlikely that MOD personnel would have been investigating the incident witnessed at Little Hayward, Staffordshire, and would therefore like to rule out this possibility. Nevertheless, we did receive a report which is similar to the one that you describe and I attach a copy of the report for your information but in line with our policy to maintain the privacy of the originator, the identifying details have been obscured.

I can also confirm that we did receive a number of reports from members of the public which relate to sightings seen in the West Midlands on 16 May 1988 and again I enclose copies of these. Although we did not investigate these sightings we believe that they could have been connected with civil air traffic/into Birmingham Airport, which was exceptionally busy at the time. Certainly the times and descriptions could be of modern jet aircraft following a holding pattern around the airport.

You also mentioned a variety of other sightings but regret that we did not receive any reports which correspond to the details that you gave. Similarly, although we were sorry to read about the effect that the May 1988 sighting in East Anglia had on the girl who witnessed it, we do not have any reports on this particular incident and because we have not investigated it we cannot offer a definitive explanation of what might have been seen. However, I can confirm that we do not possess any unpiloted vehicles which match the description of the object, nor is it likely that the USAF would have an experimental RPV in the United Kingdom. Lastly, whilst we appreciate your kind offer of indepth information on UFOs, I do not feel that, because of the reasons outlined earlier, we would be able to give them our full attention and would certainly not be able to comment on all of them. Similarly, because of our lack of resources, I regret that we cannot provide a general answering service on the subject.





Thank you for your letter of 26 February to the Secretary of State for Defence on the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs). I have been asked to reply.

I think it would be helpful if I first of all explain that whilst we do receive and co-ordinate some information about UFO sightings, the sole concern of the Ministry of Defence is to determine whether or not UFOs present a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do, and this is not normally the case, we do not attempt to investigate or identify whatever might have been seen.

Given our limited involvement with the subject, the MOD does not have any department which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying UFO reports nor do we have any staff employed on the subject full time. As you will expect, therefore, we do not carry out studies, in-depth investigations or surveys into the UFO phenomenon, nor do we possess the resources to do so. Nevertheless, we do, of course, recognise that many strange things are to be seen in the sky, although we believe that rational explanations could probably be found for most of them. Possibilities that spring to mind include satellite debris re-entering the earth's atmosphere, ball lightning, unusual cloud formations, aircraft lights to mention just a few.

Moving to your specific request, I regret that given our very limited involvement with this particular subject, we in the MOD do not possess the necessary information to give you the advice that you require. However, on a more positive note, I believe that one of the many organisations set up by enthusiasts specifically to study the UFO phenomenon are more likely to be in a position to give you the

assistance you seek. One such organisation is the Redhill and Reigate Phenomenon Research Group, Section 40 and I would suggest that if you still wish to discuss your experiences they may prove to be a good start.

I am sorry that we have not been able to help in this matter.



I refer to my previous letters dated 26 August and 10 Nevember 1988 regarding local civilian UFO investigations within the Midlands. Asknowledgement was received from you in December, premising further details.




The following is a synopsis of the appearance of anomalous lights appearing on a police-operated traffic video situated at junction 6 of the Ml motorway - the North Orbital Road intersection. Against the sky one can detect two major planetary/stellar bodies setting towards the western horizon plus the traversal of a number of aircraft.

There were two other reports made by the police at the time (Rickmansworth and Watford) and one of these sources are alleged to have videod the phenomenon using a portable patrol-car camera, but this information is yet to be confirmed.

On returning from an evening visit to Buxton, my wife and I decided to stop off and enjoy what was a beautiful starlit night. We parked up at Tegg's Nose car park, (OS Ref SK 949 732) turned out the lights and started talking. After 10/15 mins a solitary very bright light suddenly appeared in the sky, due west over Macclestield Forest (OS Ref SK 96/97 72/73) at a guesstimated height of 0.5 mile. The intensity of the light was like that of a single spotlight (similar perhaps to one of a bank at a football ground). It did not seem to have a direct beam aimed at any particular object and it shimmered with a starlight quality. The light literally appeared out of nowhere /nothing and there had been no gradual build up of intensity, it just suddenly "switched on".

I was not unduly worried but my wife was very curious and asked where it had come from, and then asked if the light was moving, I said yes, she said no. I lined the light up with 2 car park window stickers and confirmed that it was moving very slightly left to right, as if stationary but hovering. After a few minutes the intensity began to diminish but the distance from us seemed to remain constant. The light seemed to revolve around a vertical axis and it soon regained its full intensity in 10/15 secs. This was repeated a number of times before returning to its original position and intensity. I commented that its lack of movement suggested some form of helicopter/aircraft in hover mode. Having lived in Aberdeen I am very familiar with both helicopter and aircraft sounds so I wound the window down but there was absolutely no sound except for the clucking of some chickens in the valley below. I got out of the car for a better look but could not determine any physical shape beyond the light. After 10 mins it slowly moved to our left until it was directly in front of us before resuming hover mode, again there was no noise or visual contact (except the solitary light). After about a further 5 mins it slowly moved away to our left at a constant altitude and speed, again I got out of the car to listen but the only sound was a very faint receding steady hum, similar to that of a train in the far distance on a quiet night. However as it moved away I got a new view, again no discernable. shape, but a series of light thus:-MEDIUM

APPROX LENGTH J-1/2 TIMES LENGTH

Note. These lights did not flicker like a star but were of a more constant nature and there were no flashing lights visible.

I go, in the car and we followed it at speed 50/60 mph back to, and then along, the Macc-Buxton road (A 537), driving wildly to get home and get the binoculars, my wife keeping visual contact all the time as we slowly gained on it. At one time she exclaimed in one breath "look at that watch where you're going". I was concentrating hard on driving as the road outside Macc is a series of hairpin bends and so missed what she described seeing as a stairway of red lights flash down from craft to earth (approx over Kerridge Hill OS ref SK 93/94 76/77). The craft continued over Macc where we lost it, I got our binoculars and raced over to "The Edge" at Alderley Edge but to no avail. Also the orange hazy glow of suburbia had now replaced the crisp black back drop of the night sky over the hills making viewing more difficult.

I phoned the police, about 11.50pm but they had received no other reports, Manchester centre (Radar) at Manchester Airport again no reports, and the M.E.N. on Saturday morning and again no reports.

Despite the lack of independent confirmation from other sources I know what I saw that night and believe this to be an objective and accurate report of the night's events.


Both my wife and self are completely teetotal and do not take any form of drugs, prescribed or otherwise.

Thank you for your letter of 9 February which gave details of an unusual sighting that you witnessed on Tuesday 31 January 1989.

Before looking at this sighting in particular, I think it would be helpful if I explain our involvement with the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs) generally. Whilst we do receive and co-ordinate some information about UFO sightings, the sole concern of the Ministry of Defence is to determine whether or not they present a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do, and this is not normally the case, no attempt is made by MOD to investigate or identify whatever might have been seen.

The vast majority of information that we have on the subject are sighting reports, usually limited to the brief details of the incident passed on to us by those who witnessed them, such as yourself, and these are referred to our staff in the departments which are responsible for the air defence of the United Kingdom and they examine them during the course of their day to day routine.

We have no department or agency which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying UFO reports and we have no staff who are employed on the subject full time. This being the case we do not have the resources to undertake any further investigations, general surveys or studies into the UFO phenomenon.

Furthermore, I'm sure that you will appreciate that defence funds are already fully committed to the continuing security of the UK against, primarily, the threat of aggression from the Warsaw Pact countries. As such we could not justify the use of defence funds on scientific investigations, unless a clear threat to the security of th UK had been identified.

Having said all that it is clear from the reports that we receive that many strange things have been and are being observed in the sky, although we believe that rational explanations could probably be found for most of them. Possibilities that spring to mind include satellite debris re-entering the earth's atomsphere, ball lighting, unusual cloud formations, meteorological ballons, aircraft lights, aircraft at unusual angles to mention but a few.

Turning to your particular sighting, I would like to confirm that we received two other reports which corresponded to the details that you gave, but regrettably these are not as informative as yours. Nevertheless, I attach copies of the reports but in line with our policy to maintain the privacy of the originators, their identifying details have been observed.

I hope you will find this helpful. However, because we have not investigated the incident I regret that I can not offer you a definitive explanation as to what the object might have been, although it seems to me that it could have been a fireball of some sort.






Thank you for your letter of 22 January to the Prime Minister which asked about the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs). Your letter has been passed to the Ministry of Defence and I have been asked to reply. Before explaining our limited involvement with this subject, I would like to assure you that the Ministry of Defence does not try in any way whatsoever to obscure the truth about UFOs, nor do we attempt to cover up any incident which might have occurred.

Whilst we do receive and co-ordinate some information about UFO sightings, our sole concern is to determine whether or not they present a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do, and this is not normally the case, we do not attempt to investigate or identify whatever might have been seen. The sighting reports we receive, which usually are limited to the brief details of the incident passed on to us by those who witnessed them, are referred to our staff in the departments which are responsible for the air defence of the United Kingdom and they examine the reports in the course of their normal duties. Given our limited interest in UFOs we do not have any department which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying reports of UFOs nor do we have any staff who are employed on the subject full time. Similarly we do not carry out any studies into the UFO phenomenon nor do we have the resources to undertake any in depth investigations or general surveys. I am sure that you will appreciate that defence funds are already fully committed to the continuing security of the UK against, primarily the threat of aggression from the Warsaw Pact countries. This being so, we could not justify the use of defence funds on scientific investigations, unless a clear threat to the security of the UK had been indentified.

Nonetheless, it is clear from the reports that we receive that many strange things have been observed in the sky, although we believe that rational explanations could probably be found for most of them. Possibilities that spring to mind include satellite debris re-entering the earth's atmosphere, ball lightning, unusual cloud formations, meteorological balloons, aircraft lights, aircraft at unusual angles amongst many others.

Lastly, I would like to say that we do appreciate the public's concern over this very emotive subject and in this light would again wish to assure you that the Government is not trying to obscure the truth about UFOs. Certainly, we do not possess any positive evidence to suggest that "alien spacecraft" have visited the planet.

I hope that you will find this helpful.

# URORIDOLE OF BRIEBALL

A FIREBALL flared in the night sky over the Weald on Tuesday and then disappeared, leaving a UFO mystery.

The first sighting was reported at 6pm by a Charing man who phoned Headcorn aerodrome to see whether one of its aircraft might have come to grief, but none was airborne.

Fifteen minutes later two more separate sightings were reported by a man from Amhurst Bank Lane, Pembury, and by Mrs Penny Cazzola, of Bainden Cottages, Brenchley.

The Pembury resident told police that the fireball flared with a bright turquoise light, then exploded and disappeared.

Mrs Cazzola, who was driving from Horsmonden to Goudhurst, said she suddenly saw a bright light straight ahead of her.

"I wondered if it was a plane but it was just too big and it was also quite rounded. It then dropped quite quickly and disappeared behind the horizon. "When it fell it left a trail of

"When it fell it left a trail of very light bits, rather like a rocket does when it had just been lanuched" she said.

Asked whether she believed in UFOs — unidentified flying objects — she replied "I have a distinctly open mind. Something definitely fell out of the sky, so where is it now?"

Television South, based in Maidstone, said they had received a number of calls on the subject and telephoned the police at 7.35pm notifying them of the report.

A spokesman at Biggin Hill air traffic control said he had also heard of the report. He said that all local flying clubs had been contacted but there was no suggestion of any aircraft in distress.

#### ENGINE FAULT

He said: "There was a lot of fog up in this area and so there was not much flying at all. We just can't place where this ball of light came from."

Mr Chris Freeman, owner of Headcorn aerodrome, was also at a loss as to what the fireball, heading in a westerly direction, could have been.

"We had nothing airborne at all. The only thing I can suggest is that it was a light aeroplane which was having trouble with its exhaust system. Quite often when planes have that problem they emit bright sparks, but if that was the case I don't know where it could have come from." he said.

Last October two Tenterden

Last October two Tenterden policemen encountered wierd lights and "flying saucers" while on duty one October evening. They said the lights, which lasted for about four seconds, lit up the whole sky as if it was daytime.

As can be seen from the enclosed cutting from the "Courier" Newspaper for Kent and East Sussex, dated 3 February 1989, a U.F.O. was sighted over Kent on Tuesday, 31 January 1989.

The vast majority of information that we have on the subject are sighting reports, usually limited to the brief details of the incident passed onto us by those who witnessed them and these are referred to our staff in the departments responsible for air defence of the UK and they examine them during the course of their day to day routine.

The MOD has no department or agency which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying UFO reports and we have no staff who are employed on the subject full time. This being the case we do not have the resources to undertake any further investigations, general surveys or studies into the UFO phenomenon. Furthermore I'm sure that you will appreciate that defence funds are already committed to the continuing security of the UK against, primarily, aggression from the Warsaw Pact countries. As such we could not justify the use of defence funds on scientific investigations, unless a clear threat to the security of the UK had been identified.

Nevertheless it is quite clear from the reports that we receive that many strange things have been and are being, observed in the sky, although we believe that rational explanations could probably be found for most of them. Possibilities, that spring to mind include satellite debris re-entering the earth's atmosphere, ball lightning, unusual cloud formations, meteorological balloons, aircraft lights, aircraft at unusual angles to mention just a few.

To answer your question about the MOD withholding information on the UFO subject, I would like to assure you that we do not hold material back nor do we attempt to cover up incidents or obscure the truth about UFOs from the public. However, because of the provisions of the Public Records Act, which applies to all Government Departments and states that official files should remain closed from public viewing for 30 years after the last action has been taken, we regret that the release of materials "en bloc" is not possible. However, we are able to answer any specific queries you may have about particular incidents which have occurred recently and can let you know whether we have a report on the incident and if so what it contains. But, because of limited resources I am sorry that we are not able to provide a general answering service.

Lastly I must assure you that we do not try to "silence" people who have reported sightings of UFOs. Indeed I should add that despite the very limited interest which the MOD has in this subject, we are always very happy to receive reports from eye witnesses and to try to answer any questions they may have.

I hope that you will find this helpful.

Thank you for your letter of 3 January to the Duty Officer at RAF Brize Norton. As the Ministry of Defence's point of contact for those who wish to enquire about Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs) your letter has been passed to me and I have been asked if I can provide you with any further information.

Before doing so, however, I would like to stress that the subject of UFOs takes up only a small part of my total workload and as such I am not able to spend a great deal of time on it. This, of course, means that the Department cannot offer a general enquiry service nor can we begin to investigate sightings or carry out general surveys into the phenomenon on behalf of the public. because our interest in UFOs is limited to possible defence implications we do not carry out any studies into the phenomenon nor do we have the resources to undertake any indepth investigations. Obviously, we could not justify the use of defence funds which are already fully committed to the continuing security of the UK against, primarily, aggression from the Warsaw Pact countries on scientific investigations, unless a clear threat to the security of the UK had been identified.

You may also find it helpful if I explain that the information that we have on the subject is limited to the sighting reports that we receive, which usually are limited to the brief details of the incident passed on to us by those who witnessed Following receipt they are referred to our staff in the departments which are responsible for the air defence of the United Kingdom, and they examine the reports as part of their normal duties.

Moving now to your specific questions, I would like to confirm that we received one report which corresponded to the details that you gave for the incident witnessed on 14 November at 6.00pm. I regret that we found no others to match the other sightings. Nevertheless, I attach a copy of the report but in line with our policy to maintain the privacy of the originator, the identifying details have been obscured.

I hope that you will find this helpful. However because we have not investigated the incident I cannot offer you a definitive explanation as to what the object might have been , although it seems to me that it could have been a fireball of some sort.

Your father came to see me the other day and explained that you are currently studying Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs) for a school project. As the Ministry of Defence's point of contact for those who wish to correspond about the subject, he asked if I could provide you with any assistance, and although I will do what I can, you will see that our involvement with this fascinating subject is actually quite minimal, let me explain.

Our main concern is to determine whether or not UFOs present a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom, for instance unwanted intruders such as Russian "BEAR" reconnaissance aircraft coming into UK air space. Unless we judge that they do, and you will understand that this rarely is the case, we do not attempt to investigate or identify whatever might have been seen.

The vast majority of information that we have on the subject are sighting reports, usually limited to brief details of the incident, passed onto us by those individuals who witnessed them, and who felt strongly enough about it to report it. Once received they are referred to our staff in the sections responsible for the air defence of the United Kingdom and they examine the reports in the course of their day to day duties.

Although, as I have mentioned, I am responsible for answering public queries about UFOs, this is only a small part of my overall duties, which extend to providing political guidance to our Ministers and the Chief of the Air Staff. Indeed, the MOD has no staff who are employed on the UFO subject full time. You will understand, therefore, that due to our lack of resources and because our interest in UFOs is limited to possible defence implications, we do not carry out studies or investigations into the phenomenon. Im sure you will also appreciate that defence funds are already fully committed to the continuing security of the UK against, primarily agression from the Warsaw Pact countries. Obviously we could not justify the use of defence funds on scientific investigations unless a clear threat to the UK had been identified.

Having said all that, we do recognise that many strange things have been (and are being) observed in the sky; certainly the reports we receive bear this out. However, we believe that rational explanations could probably be found for many sightings. Possibilities that spring to mind include aircraft light, meteorological balloons, satellite and meteorite debris and ball lightning to mention but a few. Indeed I have witnessed many an aircraft over London which have looked mysterious during the dark hours of night.

I am sorry that I have not been able to shed a light on the mysteries of the UFO phenomena, I'm sure we would all like to know, but I hope that you will find this helpful nonetheless.





Thank you for your letter of 7 September 1988 to RAF Bawdsey which concerned the unusual sighting witnessed near RAF Woodbridge on 27 December 1980. As the Ministry of Defence's focal point for those individuals who wish to enquire about Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs) I have been asked if I can provide you with any further information. I am sorry that I have not been able to respond before now.

The only information that we possess on this incident is the report by the Deputy Base Commander of RAF Woodbridge, Lieutenant Colonel Charles Halt USAF, which I see you already have. As far as I am aware we do not hold any radar videotapes or other documentation on the "event".

To explain further, I think it would be helpful to say that whilst we do receive and co-ordinate some information about UFO sightings, the sole concern of the Ministry of Defence is to determine whether or not UFOs present a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do and this is not normally the case we do not attempt to investigate or identify whatever might have been seen. The details of the incident passed on to us by those who witnessed them, are referred to our staff in the departments which, are responsible for the air defence of the United Kingdom and they examine the reports in the course of their normal duties.

Since our interest in UFOs is limited to possible defence implications, we do not carry out studies into the UFO phenomenon nor do we have the resources to undertake any indepth investigations or general surveys. I am sure that you will appreciate that as a member of NATO defence funds are already fully committed to the continuing security of the UK and its approaches against, primarily, aggression from the Warsaw Pact countries. This being so, we could not justify the use of defence funds on scientific investigations, unless a clear threat to the security of the UK had been identified.

Moving back to the Rendlesham Forest sighting, we believe that the fact that Colonel Halt did not report the incident to MOD for almost 2 weeks

after the event, together with the low key manner in which he handled the matter are indicative of the degree of importance in defence terms which should be attached to the incident. Because of this we did not feel that there was a threat to the security of the UK and the sighting was not investigated further. However, as you will see from Colonel Halt's narrative the witnesses described the object as being approximately 3 metres long and 2 metres high. In view of this small size it was and still is, considered highly unlikely to have been a crashed piloted vehicle.

Lastly you asked about our procedures for the release of information that we might have on UFO sightings. I can confirm that although the release of any material on the subject "en bloc" is not possible because of the provision of the Public Records Act, which states that official files generally remain closed from public viewing for 30 years after the last action has been taken, we are able to answer specific queries about particular incidents which have occurred recently and can let the correspondent know whether we have a report on the incident and if so what it contains.



We have found that aircraft (of worldly origin) are usually responsible for sightings of this nature.

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



Thank you for your letter of 5 September 1988, which asked if we could provide any advice on a variety of unusual sightings seen in the Oxfordshire/Warwickshire area since 1966. I am sorry that I have not been able to reply before now.

Taking the matter generally, I think it would be fair to say that the subject of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs) takes up only a very small percentage of my total workload and as such I am not able to spend a lot of time on it. This, coupled with the fact that the sighting reports we receive are not put on a computer database, means that it would not be a simple matter to establish whether or not we had received a specific report for over 20 years ago. As a result, although we are prepared to assist with one off queries, we do not undertake general searches through our files. In addition, we require full details of when and where the sighting may have been and in order that we can easily retrieve a report (if we have one) we try to keep enquiries to within 2/3 years of the present date.

I am sure you will appreciate, that because of these limitations your request cannot be met in full and I have therefore concentrated only on those sightings which occurred in 1987. My findings are as follows:

Oxford:

29 May 1987 - No report received

North Oxford:

20 June 1987 - No report received

Uffington:

24 June 1987 - No report received

Stanton Harcourt: 29 July 1987 - No report received

Thank you for your letters of 9 December 1988 to the Air Force Operations Room, Ministry of Defence and RAF Rudloe Manor. As the MOD's focal point for those members of the public who wish to enquire about Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs), your letters have been passed to me for a reply.

I think that it would be helpful if I explain that whilst we do receive and co-ordinate some information about UFO sightings, the sole concern of the Ministry of Defence is to determine whether or not UFOs present a threat to the security and defence of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do, and this is not normally the case, we do not attempt to investigate or identify whatever might have been seen. In addition because of our limited involvement with the subject. I would like to confirm that we do not, nor have the need to collaborate with other World Government with the investigation and research of UFOs.

The vast majority of information that we have on the subject is limited to brief details of sightings that have been passed onto us by those who witnessed them and these are referred to our staff in the department which are responsible for the air defence of the United Kingdom and they examine the reports during the course of their normal duties.

Since our interest in UFOs is limited to possible defence implications we do not carry out studies into the UFO phenomenon nor do we have the resources to undertake any indepth investigations, or general surveys. I am sure that you will appreciate that defence funds are already fully committed to the continuing security of the UK against, primarily, aggression from the Warsaw Pact countries. This being so we could not justify the use of defence funds on scientific investigations, unless a clear and specific threat to the security of the UK had been identified.

Nonetheless, it is clear from the reports that we receive that many strange things have been observed in the sky, although we believe that rational explanations could probably be found for most of them. Possibilities that spring to mind include satellite debris re-entering the earth's atmosphere, ball lightning, unusual cloud formations, meteorological balloons, aircraft lights, aircraft at unusual angles, amongst others.

In your letter to RAF Rudloe Manor you asked for details of sightings reported to the MOD during 1988. Although we are still receiving a few reports from the tail end of last year, it appears that we received very nearly 400 sighting reports, which is slightly more than in recent years. The vast majority of these remain unexplained, because as I mentioned earlier, we do not investigate sightings unless a specific threat to the UK has been identified.

Lastly, in response to your request for further information, I regret that the release of any material on the subject "en bloc" is not possible as, like other government departments, all MOD files are subject to the Public Records Act. As you may be aware, this Act States that official files should generally remain closed from public viewing for 30 years after the last action has been taken. However, we are able to answer any specific queries you may have about particular incidents which have occurred recently and can let you know whether we have a report on the incident and if so, what it contains; but due to limited resources, I regret that I can not instigate general searches through our files.

I hope that you will find this helpful.

I have recently received copies of your letters dated 18 October and 4 December 1988 to Royal Air Force West Drayton and Royal Air Force Rudloe Manor respectively and have been asked to reply on their behalf. As you no doubt know by now, the Air Staff Secretariat acts as the Ministry of Defence's focal point for those members of the public who wish to enquire about Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs); certainly I seem to attract a lot of letters originally addressed to RAF stations on this subject!

Taking your letter to RAF West Drayton first you asked about the unusual sighting witnessed in the vicinity of Rendlesham Forest, near Woodbridge, Suffolk in December 1980; specifically the involvement of RAF Watton, if any. I regret that RAF West Drayton have been unable to find any records which correspond to this; indeed day to day records are rarely kept for such a length of time, and therefore there is little I can add to my letter of 7 October.

Lastly, in your letter to RAF Rudloe Manor, you asked if the station had any involvement with the UFO subject. I think it would be helpful to say that RAF Rudloe Manor is the location of the Headquarters of the RAF Provost and Security Services and although, like other stations, it receives unsolicited sighting reports from members of the public, RAF Rudloe Manor does not undertake research into the subject.






