





mentioned on April 13, 1971, that ABBIE HOFFMAN was recently telling some people that HOWIE EMMER of Kent, Ohio, wanted him to come to Kent on May 4, 1971, but HOFFMAN did not think he could make it because he was in a heavy legal struggle in order to keep his bail from being revoked. HOFFMAN was scheduled to speak in Iowa the night before (May 3, 1971) and HOFFMAN felt that if the people at Kent wanted to put him on the program it would be OK but he did not want the entire program built around him. HOFFMAN was going to try to get to Kent for May 4, 1971, but he could not guarantee it.

#### ABBIE HOFFMAN

ABBIE HOFFMAN was found guilty in the United States District Court, Northern District of Illinois, Chicago, Illinois, during February, 1970, of violation of a Federal Anti-Riot Law Statute, arising out of his participation in the riots during the Democratic National Convention held in Chicago in August, 1968. On February 20, 1970, HOFFMAN was sentenced to five years imprisonment and fined \$5,000. As a result of the trial, HOFFMAN was also found guilty on February 14, 1970, of 23 separate criminal contempts and sentenced to 8 months imprisonment. On February 28, 1970, the U.S. District Court of Appeals, Seventh Circuit, Chicago, Illinois, in ordered that HOFFMAN be released on \$25,000 bond.

The Administration of Kent State University claims that the events of last May were "uniquely curs alone", and that our remembrance of our fallon brothers and sisters should be a "family affair". We can dig it, but we consider all of you part of our family.

We say that our family is people the world over struggling against the U.S. government. Our family is at war:

it is a war between life and death;

it is a war between human beings and machines;

it is a war between cultures;

it is a war between oppressor and oppressed.

The university is playing its corporate liberal games. Their "peace and harmony" is but "law 'n order" by another name. Their attempts to make the menerial a funereal wake are but an effort to deny the engoing struggle which is the only valid means of honoring our fallen corrades. #### STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

Students for a Democratic Society, commonly known as SDS, came into existence at a founding convention held during June, 1962, at Port Huron, Michigan. From an initial posture of "participatory democracy," Marxist-Leninist ideology of various shadings became predominant during 1968-1969 with debate centering on how best to create a revolutionary youth movement. SDS moved from involvement in the civil rights struggle to an anti-Vietnam war position to advocacy of a militant anti-imperialist line linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. factions within SDS embrace Markism-Leninism and identify internationally with China, Cuba and North Vietnam as countries leading the worldwide struggles against the United States. However, the Soviet Union was regarded as imperialist and with the Communist Party, United States of America, "revisionist" in nature.

SDS operated under a national constitution which called for an annual National Convention (NC) and quarterly National Council meetings wherein programs were initiated and debated. Three national officers were elected annually with a National Interim Committee to run the organization. Regional offices and college chapters elected delegates to the national meetings but each functioned independently on local matters. Its official publication "Fire" (formerly "New Left Notes") last appeared in December, 1969.

Internal factionalism of serious proportions developed during 1968 - 1969 and the following three factions evolved as a result of a split at the June, 1969, NC: Weatherman, Worker Student Alliance (WSA), and Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM). The effect of the split on SDS chapters throughout the country was divisive. Some alligned with one or the other of the three major factions. Others, unable to identify with any faction, disassociated with SDS completely and changed names.

The SDS national office in recent years was located at 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. It was closed in February, 1970.

The Weatherman and RYM groups no longer consider themselves associated with SDS, and the WSA group refers to itself as the true SDS.

REVOLUTIONARY YOUTH MOVEMENT

that the Revolutionary Youth Movement II (RYMII) faction of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) held a national conference at Atlanta, Georgia. from November 26 to 30, 1969. At this conference it was decided to form a new organization to be known as Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM), characterized as a mass anti-imperialist youth organization, said organization being proposed as separate and distinct in form and content from SDS. "Principles of Unity" adopted by the conference included a struggle against white supremacy and male supremacy; fights against imperialism, anticommunism, fascism and oppression of youth; and support of the right of self-determination of all "oppressed nations," also support of the right of all "oppressed and exploited" peoples "to armed self-defense." It was agreed that RYM would not be a Marxist-Leninist organization; however, source said this was decided in order to indicate an organization broad enough in form to be acceptable to everyone. A temporary National Steering Committee (NSC) made up of eight females and two males was elected to govern RYM until national officers could be elected during the Spring of 1970.

RYM publications have listed the RYM National Office (NO) at Post Office Box 5421 and Post Office Box 77012 C, both Atlanta, Georgia, and a second source has advised that the NO has no office space but would probably be considered as located at Apartment 27, 1067 Alta Avenue, Northeast, Atlanta.

that women dominated the founding conference and have continued to dominate NSC meetings to the point that "women's liberation" has apparently become the RYM's principal issue - also that RYM's poor financial condition has resulted in its failure to publish a paper. During early 1970, RYM has decided to cater to the working class rather than youth, since the potential for social revolution lies in workers.

#### WEATHERMAN

Initially called the "Action Faction," Weatherman came into being immediately before the June, 1969, Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) National Convention (NC). At this NC Weatherman won all three national officer positions and a majority of the National Interim Committee as well. Subsequently, they took over the SDS National Office (NO) in Chicago, and controlled its funds, paper and national records. Although internal struggle existed until late 1969, Weatherman for all major purposes controlled SDS nationally from June, 1969, until its NO closed in February, 1970. At this time it no longer considered itself part of SDS.

The term Weatherman emerged from an ideological paper prepared by its leaders entitled "You Don't Need a Weatherman to Know Which Way the Wind Blows" ("New Left Notes" June 18, 1959). This statement outlined the basic stance of Weatherman: Marxist-Leninist in content but with strong advocacy that action not theory would bring about revolution in the United States. This posture was complemented with an international identification to the Cuban revolution and Castro's statement that the duty of a revolutionary is to make revolution.

During October, 1969, Weatherman riots in Chicago resulted in more than 260 arrests for mob action and related charges. A program of armed struggle was finalized during a December, 1969, "War Council" wherein terrorist tactics and political assassination were contemplated. The basic strength of Weatherman was then revealed to be some 300 - 350 nationally and geographically apportioned to the Midwest, New York, and some Northwest.

As its rhetoric of violence escalated, Weatherman leaders increasingly discussed the necessity of an underground operation wherein more than 90 percent of the organization would be submerged; "affinity groups" of three - five members would function independently. In February, 1970, Weatherman leaders announced a program of "strategic sabotage" with police and military installations as primary targets.

#### MORKER STUDENT ALLIANCE/PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY

National Convention (NC) of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) held in Chicago, Illinois, during June, 1969, a split arose between the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) and the National Office (NO), the NO becoming known as the Weatherman faction. The FLP faction from the largest support among those in attendance at the NC.

that during late Summer, 1969, the PLP faction of SLS established its National Headquarters (NH) on the second floor of a loft-type building at 173A Massachusetts Avenue, Boston, Massachusetts. The campaign on which the PLP faction centered was to build a worker student alliance or a campus worker student alliance. Thus, they adopted the names of Worker Student Alliance (WSA) or Campus Worker Student Alliance.

in New York City, is the official publication of the WSA faction.

that within the SDS, the WSA is a caucus of which the PLP constitutes the leadership.

during demonstrations staged in the Boston area during the Spring and Summer of 1970 by the NH, the main theme of previous demonstrations staged by the NH shifted from protestations of the Vietnam War and other United States foreign policy matters to attacking domestic issues such as racism and unemployment and demonstrating support of the "workers' struggle."

#### PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY

"The New York Times" city edition, Tuesday, April 20, 1965, page 27, reported that a new party of "revolutionary socialism" was formally founded on April 18, 1965, under the name of the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) which had been known as the Progressive Labor Movement.

According to the article, "The Progressive Labor Levement was founded in 1962 by Milton Rosen and Mortimer Scheer after they were expelled from the Communist Party of the United States for assertedly following the Chinese Communist line."

that the PLP held its Second National Convention in New York City, May 31 to June 2, 1968, at which time the PLP reasserted its objective of the establishment of a militant working class movement based on Marxism-Leninism.

Convention Milton Rosen was unanimously reelected National Chairman of the PLP and Levi Laub, Fred Jerome, Jared Israel, William Epton, Jacob Rosen, Jeffrey Gordon, and Walter Linder were elected as the National Committee to lead the PLP until the next convention.

The PLP publishes "Progressive Labor," a bimonthly magazine, and "Challenge-Desafio," a monthly newspaper.





advised on 4/13/71 that the following activity took place at the Kent Commune on 4/13/71:

At 2:15 pm, HOWIE EMMER contacted 1-212-228-5626 and a female indicates it is ABBIE's residence. EMMER identifies: himself as HOWIE from Kent and wants to speak to ABBIE, but the girl does not know if he is there. ABBIE is not there and EMMER indicates he has contacted ABBIE's residence several times, but has not heard from ABBIE.

At 4:36 pm, ABBIE (HOFFMAN) contacts the Kent Commune for HOWIE (EMMER), but he is not there. ABBIE indicates that he knows what HOWIE contacted him for, namely, to come to Kent for 5/4/71 (anniversary of the shooting of the Kent students last year) and the girl who answered says - yes.

ABBIE indicates he could say he was coming to Kent, but the chances are real slim. First of all, he is involved in a heavy legal struggle in order to keep his bail from being revoked because he went to Ireland. This is to be decided within the week and this is the first hurdle ABBIE has. The second is that ABBIE has to speak in Iowa the night before (5/3/71) so if HOWIE wants to put him on the program for the 5/4/71 Kent activities, that is OK and

ABBIE will try to get there, but he is not going to guarantee it. In other words, do not base the whole program on ABBIE coming to Kent, but he will really try to get there. That is all he can promise. ABBIE adds that things do not lock good because of his bail problems and other commitments he has made.

ABBIE does not know what is going to happen in Washington during the May Day Activities, but he will be there on the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd and they might be in jail, you know what I mean. May 4th is a very tough date but he will try to get there.


RENNIE DAVIS was found guilty in the United States District Court, Northern District of Illinois, Chicago, Illinois, during Pebruary, 1970, of violation of a Federal Anti-Riot Statute, arising out of his participation in the riots during the Democratic National Convention held in Chicago, Illinois, in August, 1968. On February 20, 1970, DAVIS received 23 individual and separate criminal contempt citations regarding the above trial, and was sentenced to two years, one month and nine days regarding these citations. DAVIS was incarcerated in the Cook County Jeil, Chicago, but was released on \$25,000 bond on February 28, 1970, pending appeal.

on April 13, 1971, that ABBIE HOFFMAN was recently telling some people that HOMIE EMMER of Kent, Ohio, wanted him to come to Kent on May 4, 1971, but HOFFMAN did not think he could make it because he was in a heavy legal struggle in order to keep his bail from being revoked. HOFFMAN was scheduled to speak in Towa the night before (May 3, 1971) and HOFFMAN felt that if the people at Kent wanted to put him on the program it would be obay but he did not want the entire program built around him. HOFFMAN was going to try to get to Kent for May 4, 1971, but he could not guarantee it.

#### ABBIE HOFFMAN

ABBIE HOFFIAN was found guilty in the United. States District Court, Northern District of Illinois, Chicago, Illinois, during February, 1970, of violation of a Federal Anti-Riot Law Statute, arising out of his participation in the riots during the Democratic National Convention held in Chicago in August, 1958. On February 20, 1970, HOFFMAN was sentenced to five years imprisonment and fined \$5000. As a result of the trial, HOFFMAN was also found guilty on February 14, 1970, of 23 separate criminal contempt citations and sentenced to 8 months imprisonment. On February 28, 1970, the U.S. District Court of Appeals, Seventh Circuit, Chicago, Illinois, ordered that HOFFMAN be released on \$25,000 bond.



cn April 29, 1971, that one of the people going to wasdington, D. C., for the May Day activities in that city on May 1 - 3, 1971, had been instructed by one of the people affiliated with the Kent Yippie movement to try to get people in Washington to come to Kent for May 4 - 6, 1971. Any of the people in Washington who were interested were to be furnished with telephone numbers in Kent to call when they arrived; also, these people should be told to avoid use of Route 43 from the Chio Turnpike to Kent because of road construction.

This individual also indicated that the people in Weshington should be told that the rustors that KSU will be closed on May 4 - 6, 1971, are bull ---- (obscene) as the town and school will be open.

If any of the people coming to Kent from Washington are stopped it was suggested that they give phony names and that they not be intimidated by the police. This individual did not feel that nowe than 50 to 100 people in Washington would be interested in coming to Kent and it would not have any adverse effect on the overall Washington activities as there would probably be a million or more people there for May Day anyway. All they want in Kent is a comple of thousand people for their May Day activities. The plans for Kent May Day are mainly to close the KSU ROTO Building by civil disobedience and then so from there, such as doing apparaments things. In addition, they were trying to get MEDIE MOTOMAN to come to Kent for the May Day program as a speaker, but he is on probation and is having trouble trying to travel. Another possible speaker might be DAVE DEMAINER.

BLACK PARTHER PARTY also known as BLACK PARTHER PARTY FOR SELF DEFENSE

According to the official newspaper of the Black Panther Party (BPP), the BPP was started during December, 1936, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics, and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by Bobby G. Scale, BPP Chairman, and Huey P. Newton, Binister of Defense, BPP.

The official newspaper, called "The Black Panther," regularly states that the BFP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm therselves against the police who are consistently referred to as "pigs" the should be killed.

The revopaper, in its issue of September 7, 1968, had an article by the then Minister of Education, George Hurray. This article ended with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere; Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is revolutionary culture. Charge. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

The BPP newspaper, issue of October 5, 1968, had an article introduced with the following statement: "We will not dissent from American government. We will overthrow it."

David Hilliard, Chief of Staff, BPP, in a speech at the San Francisco Polo Field on November 15, 1969, said - "We will kill Richard Hison."

David Hilliard, in "The New York Times," issue of December 13, 1969, was quoted as follows: "We advocate the very direct overthrow of the government by way of force and violence."

In the issue of April 25, 1970, the BPP newspaper had an article by Minister of Culture, Emory Douglas, as follows:

"The only way to make this racist US government administer justice to the people it is oppressing, is .... by taking up arms against this government, killing the officials, until the reactionary forces .... are dead, and those that are left turn their weapons on their superiors, thereby passing revolutionary judgement against the number one enemy of all mankind, the racist U. S. government."

The BPP Headquarters is located at 1046 Peralta Street, Oakland, California. Branches of the BPP, and Committees to Combat Pascism, under control of the BPP, have been established in various locations in the USA.

### STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

Students for a Democratic Society, commonly known as SDS, came into existence at a founding convention held during June, 1982, at Port Huron, Michigan. From an initial posture of "participatory democracy," Marxist-Leninist ideology of various shadings became prodominant during 1968-1969 with debate centering on how best to create a revolutionary youth movement. SDS moved from involvement in the civil rights struggle to an anti-Vietnam war position to advocacy of a militant anti-imperialist line linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. All major factions within SDS embrace Marxism-Louinism and identify internationally with China, Cuba and North Vietnam as countries leading the worldwide struggles against the United States. However, the Soviet Union was regarded as imperialist and with the Communist Party, United States of America, "revisionist" in nature.

SDS operated under a national constitution which called for an annual National Convention (NC) and quarterly National Council meetings wherein programs were initiated and debated. Three national officers were elected annually with a National Interim Counittee to run the organizemion. Regional offices and college chapters elected delegates to the national meetings but each functioned independently on local natters. Its official publication "Fire" (formerly "New Left Notes") last appeared in December, 1969.

Internal factionalism of serious proportions developed during 1988 - 1989 and the following three factions evolved as a result of a split at the June, 1999, NC: Weatherman, Worker Student Alliance (WAA), and Revolutionary Youth Movement (NYM). The effect of the split on SDS chapters throughout the country was divisive. Some alligued with one or the other of the three major factions. Others, unable to identify with any faction, dispusociated with SDS completely and changed names.

The SDS national office in recent years was located at 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. It was closed in February, 1970.

The Weatherman and RYM groups no longer consider themselves associated with SDS, and the WSA group refers to itself as the true SDS.

## REVOLUTIONARY YOUTH MOVEMENT

that the Revolutionary Youth Movement II (MYMII) faction of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) held a national conference at Atlanta, Georgia, from Hovember 26 to 30, 1969. At this conference it was decided to form a new organization to be known as Revolutionary Youth Mayoment (RYM), characterized as a mass anti-imperialist youth organization, said organization being proposed as separate and distinct in form and content from SDS. The "Principles of Unity" adopted by the conference included a struggle against white supremacy and male supremacy; fights against imperialism, anticommunism, fascism and oppression of youth; and support of the right of solf-determination of all "oppressed nations," also support of the right of all "oppressed and exploited" pooples "to armed self-defense." It was agreed that NYM would not be a Marxist-Louinist organization; however, source sold this was decided in order to indicate an organization broad enough in form to be acceptable to everyone. A temporary Entional Steering Committee (YSC) made up of eight females and two males was elected to govern RYE until rational officers could be elected during the Spring of 1970.

RYM publications have listed the RYM National Office (NO) at Post Office Box 5421 and Post Office Box 77012 C, both Atlanta, Georgia, and a second source has advised that the NO has no office space but would probably be considered as located at Apartment 27, 1867 Alta Avenue, Northeast, Atlanta.

founding conterence and have continued to dominate NSC meetings to the point that "weren's liberation" has apparently become the RYM's principal issue - also that RYM's poor financial condition has resulted in its failure to publish a paper. ## WORKER STUDENT -ALLEANCE/PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY

Thus, they adopted the names of Worker Student Alliance (WSA) or Campus Worker Student Alliance.

during demonstrations staged in the Boston area during the Spring and Sender of 1970 by the NH, the main theme of previous demonstrations staged by the NH shifted from protestations of the Victnam Mar and other United States foreign policy matters to attacking domestic issues such as racism and anemployment and demonstrating support of the "workers' struggle."

### PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY

"The New York Times" city edition, Tuesday, April 20, 1965, page 27, reported that a new party of "revolutionary socialism" was formally founded on April 18, 1965, under the name of the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) which had been known as the Progressive Labor Movement.

According to the article, "The Progressive Labor Movement was founded in 196% by Hilton Rosen and Mortimer School after they were expelled from the Communist Party of the United States for assertedly following the Chinese Communist line."

that the PLP held its Second National Convention in New York City, May 31 to June 2, 1958, at which time the PLP reasserted its objective of the establishment of a militant working class movement based on Marxielle-Loninism.

Convention Milton Rosen was unanimously reclected National Chairman of the FLP and Levi Laub, Fred Jerome, Jared Israel, William Epton, Jacob Rosen, Jeffrey Gordon, and Walter Linder were elected as the National Committee to lead the PLP until the next convention.

The PLP publishes "Progressive Labor," a bimonthly magazine, and "Challenge-Descrio," a monthly newspaper.

### MEATHERMAN

Initially called the "Action Faction," Weatherman came into being immediately before the June, 1969, Students for a Democratic Society (SPS) National Convention (RC). At this NC Ventherman won all three national officer positions and a majority of the National Interim Committee as well. Subsequently, they took over the SPS National Office (NO) in Chicago, and controlled its funds, paper and national records. Although internal struggle existed until late 1969, Weatherman for all major purposes controlled SDS nationally from June, 1969, until its NO closed in February, 1970. At this time it no longer considered itself part of SDS.

The term Weatherman energed from an ideological paper prepared by its leaders entitled "You Don't Meed a Weatherman to Know Which Way the Wind Blows" ("New Left Notes" June 15, 1939). This statement outlined the basic stance of Weatherman: Energiste Meaning to the content but with strong advocacy that action not theory would being about revolution in the United States. This posture was complemented with an international identification to the Cuban revolution and Castro's statement that the duty of a revolutionary is to make revolution.

During October, 1839, Weatherman riots in Chicago resulted in more than 200 arrests for non-action and related charges. A program of arred struggle was finalized during a December, 1969, "War Council" wherein terrorist tactics and political assessination were contemplated. The basic strength of Weatherman was then revealed to be some 300 - 350 mationally and geographically apportioned to the Midwest, New York, and some Northwest.

As its rectoric of violence escalated, Weatherman leaders increasingly discussed the necessity of an underground operation wherein more than 55 percent of the organization would be submarged; "affinity groups" of three - five weathers would function independently. In February, 1970, Weatherman leaders announced a program of "strategie substage" with police and nilitary installations as primary targets.


