The following information which was taken from the publication "The Hour" was received at the Eureau from an outside unknown source.

Every week Edward James Smythe, who is an anti-Catholic admirer of Failer Coughlin and a speaker at the /Ku Klux Klan-Bund rally in New Jersey, writes a column for Publicity, the Fascist newspaper which is published in Wichita, Kansas. The newspaper is edited by one E. J. Garner, but the man behind it is Dr. J. P. Brinkley, of "monkey-gland" notoriety. Wr. Smythe, who has declared der Feuhrer to be the Twentieth Century Ressiah, always devotes his column in "Publicity" to bitter labor baiting, violent attacks on the Jewish people and general slander against American democracy.

For the December 19th issue of "Publicity", Smythe wrote - in addition to his regular contribution a front page article. The title of this feature was Hitler's Money System Is Compared With Curs". The author, after quoting at length from Hitler's "Hein Kampf", makes this statement:

"Now Mr. and Mrs. America - Just read the above and give it your full consideration, and I want to learn your reaction. - Here is Hitler talking. .- Here he places the people before the state, not as the Jews of America AIMUNICATIONS SECTION telling you, that he takes away all your liberties -- as a matter of fact he is here taking you, and you, and you out of economic

bondage....Think that over. He outlews profits made through war...and that is the only way the world will ever have Peace —

In his column of the same issue, this ardent Hitlerite begins the compilation of his Who's Who of the United States Fifth Column:

> \*Here Are American Patriots: -- That I want every Christian American to always remember - These fire men and women are signing a re-Declaration of Independence...; Rev. Gerald B. Winrod, Wichita, Kansas; Pev. Father Charles E. Coughlin. Royal Oak, Wichigan; William El Kullgren, Editor, Beacon Light; Sobert Edward Edmondson; Charles B. Eudson; William Dudley Pelley; George Deatherage; Elisabeth Dilling; Ernst Goerner; Walter S. Steele; James True; Harry Yung; Colonel Charles Lindbergh; Congressman Thorkelson; General Van Horn Roselsy - these fine outstanding Americans and many others have been in the front line trenches for years fighting the battle for all, that we as Christian Americans hold BEAR -- Remember them in your prayers.... Other patriots will be mentioned in future columns."

## Nazi Consul Is A Charged as Spy

Fritz Wiedemann Heads Vast Espionage Setup in All Americas, Woman Says.

SAN FRANCISCO, March & (AP) .-Consul General Fritz Wiedemann was represented Wednesday as heading a German espionage ring throughout the Americas, and as having ordered his agents to obtain secret information "beneficial to Germany . . in its conquest of the Western Hemisphere."

The allegations were in a com-plaint filed for Mrs. Alice Crockett,

plaint filed for Mrs. Alice Crockett, former wife of a United States Army officer, who asked \$8,000 she said Wiedemann owed her for a trip to Germany in his behalf in 1839.

The complaint set forth that Wiedemann received more than \$5,000,000 from the German government for "espionage activity, that he employed many persons for such employed many persons for such purposes, and that it was the duty of the Princess Stephanic Hohenlohe.

whom the United States is seeking to deport, to pay these employes.'
The remainder of the complaint was made up of statements which Mrs. Crockett said Wiedemann made to her. "Statements" Repeated.

He was alleged to have told her that he obtained information "to determine by what method the Panama Canal could be made useless," that he employed officials of the United States Government, that be hired workmen in vital industries to "foment class hatred," that he encouraged strikes to undermine United States defensive strength, and that he directed the German-American Bund.

Wiedemann also was represented as having said he "worked together" with Henry Ford and Col. Charles Lindbergh, and that he (Wiedemann) was "active in secretly storing large quantities of ammunition," particularly in the East and in New Jersey, "to be used by the . . . bund . . . in fighting against the United States Government."

The complaint said Wiedemann The complaint sain wiedemanning told Mrs. Crockett he had placed Dr. Friedhelm Draeger in charge of the Fast Coast German propaganda division, Dr. Mathias Schmitz in charge of the New York division, and Herman Schwinn in charge of the West Coast division.

Wiedemann, consul general here since early in 1939, denied all such charges when a similar suit was filed by Mrs. Crockett in superior court, and his attorney termed the action a "shakedown."

#### "Check Up" Trip.

The consular official was a su-perior officer of Adolf Hitler in the World War, and was Hitler's person-al aid and confident from Jan. 1,

1935, until coming here.

Mrs. Crockett's complaint said

Wiedemann owed her \$3,000 for
six months' service and \$5,000 in expenses for visiting Hitler and other high officials in Germany and ascernigh officials in Germany and ascirtaining that they believed Wiedemann was "properly fulfilling" his duties as consul general and in the "espionage service."

The trip, the complaint said, was taken after Wiedemann had a "serious misunderstanding" with the

German government.

The complaint asserted that Wiede-mann remarked he "used" Colonel Lindbergh "to lull America and Americans into a sense of false security and into believing that America was and is safe from Germany and German attack." It said, too. that the consul general had stated he "worked together" with Ford "in furthering the German and Nazi cause in the United States."

#### STORY FORD AIDED BUND 18 TERMED "OUTRAGEOUS LIE"

DETROIT, March 5 (P). — Commenting on a complaint filed in federal court in San Francisco, I. A. Capizzi, attorney for the Ford Motor Company, said Wednesday night that "any statement that Henry Ford is working alone or with anyone else to further any foreign cause whatever is an outrageous lie."

Capizzi referred to the complaint by Mrs. Alice Crockett against Fritz Wiedemann, German consul-general at San Francisco, in which Wiede-mann was said to have received more than \$5,000,000 from Germany for espionage in the United States and elsewhere in the Western Hemi-

The complaint, alleging that Wiedemann directed German-American Bund activities in the United States, said Wiedemann told Mrs. Crockett that he "worked together with" Col. Charles A. Lindbergh and Henry Ford.

## Weide mann Says For 1, Lindy Tale 'Fantasy'

By United Press

SAN FRANCISCO, March 6—German Consul General Fritz Wiedemann today denounced as "pure fantasy" a charge that he collaborated with Col. Charles A. Lindbergh and Henry Ford "to further the Nazi cause in this country"

The accusation was made by Mrs. Alice Crockett, 37 divorced wife of Lieut. Col. Gilman Crockett of Camp Jackson, S. C., who claims Capt. Wiedemann owes her \$8000 for five months of confidential work among his masters in Germany. She filed an amended suit yesterday in Federal Court.

#### 'ALL BUNK'

"All bunk. From the first word to the last, it's all bunk. The whole thing's pure fantasy. That's all I have to say," Capt. Wiedemann commented at the consulate. He appeared amused, rather than angry.

A Ford spokesman said in Detroit that the suit "appears to be a publighty stunt."

Mrs. Crockett said Princess Stefaute Hohenlohe of Hungary was Capt. Wiedemann's agent, paying his workers in the United States.

Mrs. Crockett said Capt. Wiedemann told her, among other things, that: Sigrid Schultz, Chicago Tribune cor-

Sigrid Schultz, Chicago Tribune correspondent, was employed by the German propaganda division to extol Naziism in dispatches to this country, and Capt. Wiedemann and his aides tried to determine the reaction to them.

The Panama Canal Zone was fertile ground for espionage, and Capt. Wiedemann knew how the canal could be made useless.

Government officials, plant superintendents, foremen and workmen in U. S. steel and munitions industries were in his pay.

#### NEW JERSEY ARSENAL

He directed activities of the German-American Bund and had stored secret arsenals in the United States, particularly in New Jersey, to be used at the opportune time.

She charged the German government gave Capt. Weidemann \$5,000,000 "to promote strife and class hatred in the United States," and he "did employ ruffins to stir racial hate . . . and pay such ruffins from funds of the German government . . . and did encourage strikes in all types and kinds of industries in the United States for the purpose of destroying untiy and undermining the strength and ability of the United States to prepare for national defense."

Col. Lindbergh, she said, was Chpt. Wiedemann's tool in efforts to "ull imerica and Americans into a sense if false security." She said the consulted her Col. Lindbergh was considered

the "best German propagandist in the country."

Mrs. Crockett said he owed her \$8,000, salary and expenses, for sounding out Adolf Hitler, Joseph Goebbels, and Field Marshal Herman Goering in 1939, about his work in this country. He feared they were dubious of his ability she said, but she was able to report that they thought he was the best man available for the job.

Wiedemann was a captain in the World War; Hitler was his motorcycle dispatch rider.







By letter dated August 22, 1940, advised the Louisville field division

Is someone trying to "spoof" me or is there really something sinister back of all this? I have written any number of letters to the Courier Journal and Times commending Col. Jan. Lindbergh. Every time I have a letter published I am swamped with letters and cards like the two I am sending you. As you see, some of them are postmarked Lebanon, Ky. That is what puzzles me.

Do you want me to correspond with these "fifth columnist" at specified intervals and report to you my findings, or would you advise me to ignore them as cranks?

I would like to be of service to my country in any way possible, so advise me what to do if I can be of any assistance.

I still think someone should have their neck broken for trying to connect Col. Lindbergh in any way with such a low down movement. If you have no use for the literature return it to me I should! like to keep it as a souvenir. Thanks for an early reply.

## Sees Attempt To Frighten Americans

### Bowdoin Professor Deplores Talk

Special Despaich to The Press Herald Brunswick, May 23-Lashing out at those who he alleges are seeking at those who he alleges are seeking to confuse a well-meaning and honest public with nightmare apparitions. Prof. Newton P. Stallknecht, associate professor of philosophy at Bowdoin College, in a chapel address today urged the students to mature their opinions and make them heard. He quoted from a recent address by Admiral Yarnell that the United States is safe from foreign invasion.

Prof. Stallanecht termed the recent talk by Col. Charles Lindbergh as honest, intelligent, courageous opinion, but added it was presented a bit tactiessly.

"Why then all these alarms?" asked Prof. Stallknecht. "Why all this talk from high school to Congress of winged warriors descending upon us?" Why this attempt to torture the public? Have they not heard enough already? Why repeat Orsen Welles' horrible fairy tale about the Martians? That, to be sure was an accident. But there is nothing accidental about its repetition. repetition.

"If the people desire to involve use in war for reasons of economics, of international morality or sheer prestige, let them speak out but their critics must require them to state their true reasons. And they should refrain from confusing a well-meaning and honest public with nightmare apparitions. We all know that the state of the world is bad enough as it is without such fantastic dis-"If the people desire to involve us it is without such fantastic distortions.

tortions.

"It is my belief that an effort is now being made to frighten the American people. We hear from the President of the United States a public statement of the flying times from Greenland to Maine and from Bermuda to New York City. And these seem merely to be offered as evidence seem merely to be offered as evidence that we cannot possibly stand aloof from the European conflict. To be

the grandent does for met, the Francett does not — as met at any rate — urge that we send troops to Europe — but he certainly seems willing to hint that a wolf of some sor, may be soon at the door — a savage wolf with wings. He clearly wants us to believe that the United States is really considered in danger. He advocates a vast armament of airplanes — five times what one general considers adequate for defense. This armament is to be built under war-time measures which suspend competitive bidding, and some labor regulations which in recent years have been prepared to protect the forgotten man.

"Now of course we do not know what the Administration's next move will be. In fairness, we must admit that it may not be an unwise one. But it will be most unwise and unfair

that it may not be an unwise one. But it will be most unwise and unfair if it involves any further effort to frighten the public. A frightened public means a confused Congress that dares not appear to ignore popular excitement. And such a Congress is likely to do the wrong thing. No leader who frightens his people is a truly Democratic leader.

"Not so long ago one leader told us that grass would grow in the streets if he were not elected. And soon other leaders may be telling us that foreign bombs will be bursting in air if they are not reelected.

"Since I have gone so far it appears only fair to you that I state more fully my opinions concerning our proper attitude toward the war. I will not say that the European war is no concern of ours. It is very obviously a cause of great and distressful concern. We talk, these days, of little else and we must take an intelligent stand concerning it.

"The war abroad is a painful matter for all of us—it is inhuman to laugh at it or even to try to forget it. I am sure that everyone here is ready to contribute generously to the Red Cross funds and to offer help to refugees when the chance arises. Americans have experience in organizing such assistance and such help can be offered with a clean conscience.

"But there is no ground upon which our own Government has a right to interfere in this war. Our Government is not a militant benev-Our olent society for policing the world. Since we have proceeded according to that assumption, we should not suddenly desire to enforce law and order on a grand scale in Europe or Asia. on a grand scale in Europe or Asia. To desire to do so under these circumstances is nothing but militant sentimentalism—which is at once the worst kind of sentimentalism and almost the worst kind of militarism. "With reasonable foresight and good leadership we may insure our safety and the continuity of our circuit and c

ilization for years to come and this is the only end we should instruct our government to pursuee. This is not all. We should make certain that not all. We should make certain that our government hears our instructions. There are involved in such a policy many special problems. Probable logs of much foreign trade is one of them. But even this is a small price to pay for the sanity and wholesome living which was is amost certain seriously to impair."

It has always seemed to me that since August 1939, when I received a letter from my German friend, saying "We will invade Poland on September 1st and Poland will cease to exist as a nation in 30 days - then it will be France's turn, then England's, then, we shall see who won the last war," that this was "our war" and from its very inception. It is our war now, we surely know. Or do we?

In the words of Life's editor, Mr. Luce, "We cannot win this war until we come to the knowledge that we might lose it."

This war will be the longest, most ruthless and bloodiest war you ever heard of. It will not all be fought in Borneo, "or what have you" but will very conceivably be fought partly between San Francisco and New York and very likely in Alaska, in Mexico and most assuredly in Panama and, of course, in Africa, in Europe and in Australia. This is truly a World-Wide War.

Neither Japan nor Germany will collapse, at least not in any conceivable immediate future. The Philippines are gone. Singapore, the Indies, even Turkey and Africa may fall and soon. And, no matter, except that another million men will die and the war will last another year. Mistake it not, there is but one enemy that we face and that we must defeat and that enemy is Nazi Germany. Japan will fall when Germany falls and not one hour before.

There is but one grave, great and immediate danger to America, namely that England may be invaded. If the British Isles fall, our situation is desperate indeed, for Britain is the "nerve center" of all resistance today, even though Russia is the "strong right arm" at the moment.

As yet we have no adequate army. Rather, a large group of individuals. A Buyer here in Chicago told me recently that if one single German landed at New York, he would take his rifle and go down. He meant this as a patriotic gesture but really it is defeatist in its effect. For, if we, you and I, "wait" until Nazis land anywhere then we are on the verge of defeat and we, as well as Mussolini, will be "lackeys" to the "Herren Volk" - the "Master Race". It is we that must do the "landing" or we will indeed, be the slave state.

The American Quislings have not changed their minds, they are merely biding their time. All hell will be to pay in these beloved United States of ours, and, when the going gets tough, watch the Darlan's and the Laval's in America and the Lindbergh's and the Nye's and the Coughlin's. They show signs of having the "Gauleiter" complex.

When the \$30,000 salaried, export sales executive of a great Detroit Motor Car Manufacturer, living in Pleasant Ridge in Detroit, when, I say, such a man is convicted by the Federal Courts of espionage and admits having constantly advised Germany of our detailed army plane production, plant by plant and design by design, then, I say we had best watch the "Appeasors" and the "Nazi-medal-wearers" and the apologists for Herr Schickelgruber.

Neither have we sold the hundreds of premium, chain, furniture and "schlag" houses who are coming in to see us in droves, both here at the Housewares Show in Chicago, and in our New York office. We are not, have not and will not sell the second story "discount houses" that you so justly complain of (and about which you do nothing).

All our items are for your counters and for the shelves of our other established and key accounts. We have, to date, filled 90% of your orders complete. We are still doing so and can continue, we feel, longer than the average of your resources.

May I say, also, that wood products are becoming scarce and will shortly be as difficult to obtain, perhaps as steel. To those who say "how come?" and add "the camps are all built", I reply, the camps have not even been started as yet and relatively speaking, of course.

A concrete case is the cancelling of 21 cars of lumber due us at the present time. Another 3 cars of Southern pine also suddenly taken by government priorities and only last week.

Do not believe that the government will freeze your legitimate stocks of normal housewares, nor any items therein. Freezing of automobile stocks has no bearing on housewares. Naturally with auto production stopped, cars on hand must not be "gobbled up" by those with ready cash in their jeans, but must, in all conscience, be rationed, if that be the right word, but of course "sold" to those individuals and firms whose service to the public most urgently requires new transportation.

No car dealer will have his cars requisitioned or will lose his investment as the appeasers are apt to "whisper".

Rumor mongering, cursing the government, daming Roosevelt, daming England; apologizing for Hitler, condemning the Catholics, "God-daming" the Jews, all will not help us win this war. Let us stop these dangerous, if unconscious fifth columnists.


On Movember 27, 1940, a woman styling herself as called at the office of the NY Field Div. and advised

Her reason for suspicioning of Espionage activities was that during a conversation with his in the

store, while looking at antiques, she had told him that she had lived in Germany and he seemed very interested. He told her that his wife was German and that they had formerly lived in Frankfort, Germany. During the course of their conversation, he spoke of "our man lindbergh" and seemed extremely annoyed at himself for having made this statement. Informant stated that she would have attached no significance to this statement except that she had heard from another source that the Fascists in this country planned to use LINDBERGH as a front man for Fascist activities in this country. She was unable to state where she had heard this information.
